August Programs at the Davis Branch Library

(Woodland, CA) – Cool programs continue during the month of August at the Mary L. Stephens Davis Branch Library, located at 315 E. 14th Street in Davis:

- Summer Reading Program 2018: Reading Takes You Everywhere, May 20 August 18: Sign up and get a free book! Choose your summer challenge: read 10 books, read for 10 hours, or read for 10 days. There will be activities, events, and prizes all summer long. (All game boards must be turned in by August 18 to participate in the prize drawing.)
- **Read off Your Fines!, May 20 August 18:** The Read Off Your Fines campaign will be held in conjunction with the Summer Reading Program. Young adults and children (ages 17 and under) will be able to deduct \$1.00 from their fines for every 15 minutes spent reading a book of their choice in the library and also use those minutes toward earning incentives in the Summer Reading Program.
- August 1: Project Buttons and Bookmarks, 7:00 p.m. Use our animal stencil collection to make a new bookmark or button.
- August 2: Read Across the Waves, 2:00 p.m. This interactive Summer Reading Program event presented by Fenix Drum and Dance Company introduces children and families to the music and traditional dance of Africa, the Caribbean, and the Americas.
- August 4: Block Party, 2:00 p.m. Join us for hours of creation, design, and play with Lego Blocks. This is a drop-in program. Parents/caregivers are encouraged to stay and play alongside their children. Not recommended for children under 3.
- August 6 & 13, Kindergarten Readiness, 2:00 p.m. The second half of this four-week series will help kids learn school readiness skills through books, songs, crafts, and more. This program is best suited for children who will start kindergarten in the fall.
