4. PUBLIC COMMENT

- Nicole Sturmfels: shared that the MCAH Advisory Board presentation she gave to the Board of Supervisors went well; Supervisor Oscar Villegas was interested in hearing our end of the year summary; he was very impressed by the membership of our board
- Lizeth Bentacourt: shared that August is National Breastfeeding month and the first week of August we will be celebrating world breastfeeding week; the breastfeeding peer counselor group will be holding a celebration in the Community Room for pregnant and breastfeeding mom's; will be sharing community resources with them; this event will take place on Wednesday, August 1st. On Saturday August 3rd, the breastfeeding coalition will be hosting a latch on event, this will be the 3rd year for this event; this event is geared towards community promotion; last year there was about 30 mom's with babies that participated; this even will be held at the Davis Farmers Market. This is a synchronized world event; where mom's all breastfeed or pump at the same time throughout the world.

5. COMMUNITY HEALTH BRANCH REPORT – Anna Sutton

- Anna Sutton-shared that MCAH group is wrapping up the fiscal year and has submitted their proposal to the state; they have developed a new scope of work and new performance measures; we are currently doing a Community Health Assessment for Yolo County residents; please encourage Yolo County residents to fill one out. If you have questions on how to access the survey, email Anna at anna.sutton@yolocounty.org
- **Cyndi Martin** shared that the Service Center continues to have long wait times on the phone; application processing timeframe is getting closure to compliance; if you are a continuing customer and have questions regarding your case, the wait time is still long; people that come into the office they are still being asked to call in. Cyndi shared that clients are receiving phone numbers or text messages from phone number (323)236-4589; it is instructing them to call the number, where an automated recordings asks them to provide personal information including their EBT card number and PIN. Once

the information is given the perpetrators create a card and withdraw the funds. Please let your clients know now to give any other information out.

• Dr. Chapman: shared that we recently held an oral health summit with approximately 30 participants. Dr. Chapman attended the first ever state wide Oral Health Summit; the event was sold out with a wait list; the state is creating info-structure around oral health; there is now funding for oral health from tobacco tax money; this money started coming in January 1st to have every jurisdiction in California has to create an oral health program, we have staff starting July 1st, this program will intersect with CHDP and MCAH.

6. REVIEW SUMMARY OF 0-5Y/O PROCESS MAPPING EXERCISE FROM MAY MEETING & ID THEMES FOR PLATFORM STATEMENT – Anna Sutton

HANDOUT:

- **Dr Schimmel**: shared that there are tools for screening and surveillance but implanting them is a struggle; there is no system in place for 0-5; families come in for vaccines but then the families get lost; there's issues with compliance and getting families to come in if kids are healthy.
- A lot of people can't afford to take time off of work. The example was given of seasonal works that can't take the time of work, if they take time off they will not get paid; a lot of people use their vacation and sick time to take their children to the doctor
- All agencies not matter what type of agency should encourage families to take their kids in regularly for early screenings; we may have to create messaging as an Advisory Board.
- We should encourage health care providers to offer after hour and weekend visits for well child exams
- Many people only take their kids to the doctor is when there is an emergency.
- A lot of parents don't know that their child has a developmental delay and if they do they don't have the time to take them into the doctor to get assessed
- After hour regular clinics for working parents
- Educating parents on the resources available for parents
- Once a child enters the public school system they no longer qualify for services
- Once a child turns 3; they enter the public school jurisdiction and are no longer eligible for services
- When a mom brings in the baby for their IZ's educate mom on maternal mental health; if possible doing a quick 5 question survey to screen mom; mom's mental health is going to impact her care for the baby
- We lose a lot of children from age 2 to until they come in for their vaccines at 4
- Reaching out to Headstart to see what is working for them to get their children to complete their physicals
- For those families that work, parents don't see their children throughout the day; the childcare provider is the one observing the child's behavior; it would be great to be able to get in those childcare providers
- Healthcare systems don't have the capacity for to see all these preventive visits
- A lot of household are single family households and in childcare or subsidized childcare; parents don't see their children for the majority of the day because they're working; a lot of parents don't pick up on the signs that their child may have a delay
- Childcare providers are helping with the development of our children; we should be reaching out to them and help educate them
- Reaching out to IMPACT Program they help train Children's Home Society
- Licensing for childcare with children under 4 years; it would be great to have a mandate for them to perform a developmental screening for their license
- IMPACT Group goes into these childcare providers and train the staff on how to perform ASQ's

- The childcare provider feeling as though they don't have the power to let the parents know that they believe their child has a developmental concern
- The take away from this is that there is a gap between 0-3, we have some tools but don't know all of the tools in our county
