# **Food Enhancement Project**

Food drives are conducted at 11 sites since January 2018. Food is distributed to Partner Agency Program members located in:

- Arbuckle (serving Dunnigan)
- Davis
- Esparto
- Knights Landing
- Madison
- West Sacramento
- Winters
- Woodland
- Zamora

## **Benefits to Community Families:**

- As of June 2018 we have collected and distributed 41,450 lbs. of food -drive food.
- All food is sorted with outdated and inedible items removed, thus increasing the quality of food, and saving Partner organization staff time
- Partner organizations receive an average of 500-1,000 lbs. of free food monthly. Weekly, we deliver a pallet of food to Yolo County Children's Alliance, who serve about 130 families with children.
- As of June 2018, roughly \$20,000 of Partner organization's funds, normally spent on necessary food, have been freed up for other uses.
- Partners can still have food drives, but they can rely on us to provide large amounts of food without the investment of their staff's time or organization's money.
- Over this calendar contract year, we have agreed to provide 95,000 lbs. of food to Yolo County Partner Agencies

Side Note: We historically receive 60% of our total poundage of food drive food between October and end of December.
