## Fun for All at the Yolo Classic Car and Truck Show

**(Woodland, CA)** – On August 25, over 700 people were entertained by the third annual “Cruisin’ into the Next Chapter” Classic Car and Truck Show and family fun day at the Yolo Branch Library. The event was sponsored by the Friends of the Yolo Branch Library and the Yolo Library, located at 37750 Sacramento Street in Yolo.

Over 140 classic cars and trucks lined the streets in the town of Yolo. Most of the entries came from Dunnigan, Zamora, Yolo, and Woodland with one traveling from Southern California and several more from the Central Valley and Bay Area.
