

#### Gentlemen:

Enclosed is the 1967 Yolo County Agricultural Crop Report as required by Section 65.5 of the California Agricultural Code.

The gross value of production of \$85,592,430 is 9.9 million below the 1966 gross income figure of 95.5 million. Of the ten leading crops in 1966, only has was able to show a slight gain during 1967 while the other nine fell below the prior years gross income.

The reduction of almost 10 million dollars in farm income can be attributed to two factors; lower prices being paid to the farmer for his products, and a long wet winter that prevented or delayed the normal planting of crops. The enclosed statistics are the estimated gross returns and should not be taken as representing a measure of profit to the producer.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation to the farmers, producers and other organizations who have supplied the necessary data to make this report possible.
