Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) at CommuniCare


- Started July 2016- Federal funding for Health Centers
 - Treatment for Opioid Use and Alcohol Use with medications and concurrent therapy.
 - Multi-disciplinary team (Physician/Nurse Case Manager/Behavioral Health)
 - Woodland, West Sacramento and Davis sites
 - Suboxone, Vivitrol
 - Engage in SUD Behavioral Health Services concurrently.

Yolo NTP Providers

- CORE Medical Sacramento, anticipate opening West Sacramento Location January 2019
 - **▼ 105** Yolo Clients as of July 2018 –**Methadone**: 93 clients 72% West Sacramento, 16.2% Woodland, 8.5% Davis, 1.1% Knights Landing, 1.1% Esparto, 1.1% Clarksburg
 - **Buprenorphine**: 12 clients 25% West Sacramento, 16.7% Woodland, 41.7% Davis, 8.3% Esparto, 8.3% Winters
- BayMark 2 Sacramento Locations, 1 Fairfield Location
 - **▼ 80** Yolo Clients as of July 2018

Hub and Spoke Benefits

- In partnership with <u>CORE Medical Clinics</u>
- Expanded services
- Develop broader safety net
- Expand number of prescribers
- Funding for uninsured
- Increase access for community



Changing Organizational Behavior

- SUD Culture from Social to Medical Model
- Medication Assisted Treatment
- Workload has changed, Documentation
- Engaging providers: weekly high utilizer meetings, workgroups, hot topic groups
- Behavioral Health Integration
- Less time in Residential: Stabilization
- Client's unsettled expectation
- Evidence Based Practice fidelity
- Transitions of Level of Care

Next Steps

- Efforts already underway
 - CCHC/CFMG partnering on in-custody Vivtrol treatment
 - CORE opening West Sacramento clinic
 - CCHC/CORE outreach to more waivered prescribers
 - CCHC to develop additional outcome measures for MAT
- Further coordination needed
 - Hospitals implementing Vivitrol prior to discharge
- Future funding opportunities
 - DHCS Opioid Treatment Grants
