November Programs at the Davis Branch Library

(Woodland, CA) –Bring your family and friends to the following fall programs held during the month of November at the Mary L. Stephens Davis Branch Library, located at 315 E. 14th Street in Davis:

- November is Native American Heritage Month! All Yolo County Library branches will celebrate
 with displays highlighting the history and culture of the Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation and recommended
 reading.
- November 1: WWI Series Part 4: Lest We Forget: The Road to Peace, 6:00 p.m. Come learn the story of, and commemorate, all those from the Davis area who served, both at home and abroad, in the "War to End All Wars."
- November 3: Introduction to Local Hiking!, 10:00 a.m. Join special guest Geoff Benn and learn all about local hiking opportunities. Come hear about hiking gear, safety and how to identify common plants and trees. Enter the drawing to win a backpack filled with hiking supplies.

Little Deer is a young California Indian, whose journey and experiences take him to the discovery of the first Native American flute. Food for Fines & Pay It Forward: The Yolo County Library is offering residents and library card holders two opportunities to feed and support their communities this holiday season with 'Food for Fines' and 'Pay It Forward.'

The first opportunity is through the Library's annual "Food for Fines" program that allows library card holders to clear \$1 from their Yolo County Library overdue fines for each nonperishable food item donated at the circulation desk of any Yolo County Library location. The program runs November 13 through December 31 and there is no limit to the number of donations or reduction in fines cardholders can receive. Library card holders are welcome to donate even if they do not have any overdue fines.

The second opportunity is through the Library's 'Pay It Forward' program that allows customers to help library card holders pay off their overdue fines. Customers are welcome to donate money and write a message on a star-shaped note that will be posted on a board behind the circulation desk.

All programs are free to attend and, unless otherwise stated, no registration is required. Programs are sponsored by the Friends of the Davis Public Library.
