## **November Programs at the West Sacramento Branch Library**

- November is Native American Heritage Month! All Yolo County Library branches will celebrate
  with displays highlighting the history and culture of the Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation and recommended
  reading.
- November 1-10: Elf on the Shelf! Our Sneaky Elf had so much fun hiding in the library last year that she is visiting us early this year. **Food for Fines & Pay It Forward:** The Yolo County Library is offering residents and library card holders two opportunities to feed and support their communities this holiday season with 'Food for Fines' and 'Pay It Forward.'

The first opportunity is through the Library's annual "Food for Fines" program that allows library card holders to clear \$1 from their Yolo County Library overdue fines for each nonperishable food item donated at the circulation desk of any Yolo County Library location. The program runs November 13 through December 31 and there is no limit to the number of donations or reduction in fines cardholders can receive. Library card holders are welcome to donate even if they do not have any overdue fines.

The second opportunity is through the Library's 'Pay It Forward' program that allows customers to help library card holders pay off their overdue fines. Customers are welcome to donate money and write a message on a star-shaped note that will be posted on a board behind the circulation desk.

Unless otherwise stated, all programs are sponsored by the West Sacramento Friends of the Library, are free to attend, and do not require registration.
