4. Public Comment

- John Troidl shared information about a program the Student Health Services is offering on the UC Davis campus, "Helmet Hair, Don't Care". Students will receive a free bike helmet when they sign a pledge to wear their helmet; but the program is currently out of helmets. John will get information about sponsorship and report back if anyone is interested.
- John Troidl announced UC Berkley is celebrating their 75th anniversary for their School of Public Health.
- Michael Wilkes gave a brief PowerPoint presentation on the <u>100th anniversary of the Spanish flu.</u>
- **5. STATE AND COUNTY UPDATE** Jill Cook, County Administrator's Office
 - **Budget:** On September 25th, the Board adopted the FY2018-19 budget. The Board also adopted allocated funding for the Rural Community Investments Programs to start designing a park, playing fields, and walking trails for the community in Knights Landing.

• Adult Day Health Center: On September 25th, staff provided the Board an update on the Adult Day Health Center. Staff has been working with Dignity Health over the last few years to figure out a new facility or how to expand at the current facility.

On October 9th, the Board allocated funding to work with an engineer to look at three options:

- Renovation and expansion of the current site
- o Explore building a new facility
- Obtaining an existing facility and do improvements as needed
- **6. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS UPDATE** *Tara Thornson, Deputy to Supervisor Saylor*
 - **Strategic Planning Session:** On October 2nd the Board hosted a Strategic Planning Session where Brian Vaughn and Dr. Chapman presented the Community Health Improvement Plan update, and touched on Health in All Policies.
 - Fetal Infant Mortality Rate (FIMR): Supervisor Saylor wants to thank the Fetal Infant Mortality Rate committee for holding a ceremony on October 7th, for families in Yolo County to honor the lives of the children lost.
 - Mental Illness Awareness: The Board recognized October 7-13 as Mental Illness Awareness Week.
 - **Partnership Health:** On October 7th Partnership Health gave an update to the Board. They have been seeing a reduction in enrollment over the last twelve months versus the typical growth; and the concern is that the reduction might be tied to immigration and public charge federal policies.
- 7. COMMUNITY HEALTH BRANCH REPORT Brian Vaughn, Public Health Director Branch Report
 - Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP): Presented the CHIP to the Board of Supervisors on October 2nd. As we develop the new CHIP, which will go into effect in 2020, we would like to have the Health Council be more involved, have a leadership role, and help develop the CHIP by using your expertise.
 - Women, Infants and Children (WIC): Our WIC program was one of two recipients of the state to receive the Loving Support Award of Excellence Gold Award for the Breastfeeding Peer Counseling Program.
 - **Fetal Infant Mortality (FIMR):** Held our first FIMR event on October 7th, the memorial service was a lovely event, and we hope to have this event every year.
- 8. HEALTH OFFICER REPORT Ron Chapman, Health Officer
 - STDs: Chlamydia, Gonorrhea and Syphilis rates are increasing countywide, statewide and nationwide. In the last 1-2 months, Yolo County has seen a concerning trend of an increase of Syphilis in pregnant women. We will be talking to the state within the next few days to discuss a game plan for outreach for both men and women who are undiagnosed.
 - **Influenza:** The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) is reporting the Flu vaccine this year is a good match, assuming that the virus does not mutate.
 - Health in All Policies (HiAP): The workgroup has contacted Monterey County, who has a robust HiAP infrastructure and capacity in their county, and one of the things they have is a Health Impact Review team. Their Health Impact Review team reviews policies that the county is considering, and let the county elected officials/decision makers understand the health impacts the policies may have. We are going to try and better understand what the Health Impact Review looks like.
