THE POSITION

Our Psychiatrists work primarily in the Adult & Aging Branch of the Health and Human Services Agency; perform outpatient psychiatric evaluations of patients; develop and implement treatment plans; provide consultation services to staff, departments, schools, community organizations, courts, and other agencies. Essential functions of the position include:

- Conduct examinations to assess patient's social, emotional, and physical condition.
- Conduct psychiatric evaluations of patients, and develop and implement appropriate ongoing treatment.
- Prescribe and dispense medication.
- Apply individual and group treatment techniques in order to effect positive behavioral change.
- Coordinate patient use of multi-human services resources such as medical, welfare, school, probation, public health, or conservatorship services.
- Interpret and explain to patients and relatives the social and emotional factors of mental disorders.
- Prepare case history summaries and determine that all significant aspects of cases have been considered.

THE AGENCY

The Health and Human Services Agency (The Agency) was formed on July 1, 2015, and encompasses the departments formerly known as Employment & Social Services (Public Health, and Alcohol, Drug, and Mental Health).

The Agency has several branches (Adult & Aging, Child, Youth, & Families, Community Health, Service Centers, and Fiscal & Administration), each of which provides myriad services to County residents.
