- Sam-MH Service Act Annual update, complete 6 annual updates with community members. Changes in
 QM structure, staffing, Katherine Barrett is now the Compliance Officer. New positions posted-providers

- David Hafter-PEI working two new programs Grief groups provided mostly in school. Support over grief and loss issues. Mindfulness Matters Techniques to help gently calm themselves in class
- Rich manager access team –after hour services to ED/Access line support
- Marshall Stenson-hoping to open up center early next ear
- Jennie-all programs for Children Child Welfare-new effective October 1st we can do assessments for all children entering into system
- Ian-took over Homeless Services looking to build team, looking to hire Case Managers and Homeless Clinicians.

2. DIRECTORS REPORT

Last month's MH Directors Report sent as an attachment

- Milestone hit staff was decimated in 2004-2009 and since we have slowly been growing, by end of
 October we will have 24/7 Access Crisis Line in community. Three fully functional MH clinics up and
 running. Navigation Center will also operate at a full time clinic once up and running increasing access
 to the community. Once limited services, we will now have the community covered 24/7, and it feels
 good.
- Navigation center will be located in Davis at the Pacifico, Navigation on one floor and other services in two floor and ARF on the other floors. Nice place for people to live and receive services all at once.
- Homeless update-we took over Homeless Services about 4 years ago and its grown from 2 million to 6
 million and we have dramatically increased the staffing from zero to 8.5 fte. Direct service staff on
 the Homeless Team has been requested by the community.
- June-Pacifico plans did not discuss plans for all the additional floor use in the building. Per Karen it's in the planning phases and it's hard to say at this point what will fill the building.

• FNP at the Urgent Care Center-planned for October 2018. The furniture was ordered and is now in place and ready for service

Mary (internal)-1 clinician

Megan- Access Screening and Referral,

Amara-hospital discharge planning, Clinician MDIC Referrals, currently clinicians doing are doing primary and without the help of interns

- Marcy- regularly direct clients to Turning Point Children's Services-three children programs adjunct behavioral then hand over behavior plan and send to PCP to continue care in 30 to 90 days. Serving up to age 15. Engaging families that are underserved and have flexibility to stabilize family support. Address any clinical concerns. 100 primary slots primary MH slots. TBS is where behavior is happening. Standard Trauma Informed Practices and PCT. BRO is hip hop therapy program we are at crossroads because last standing clinicians is resigning and we have plans for the program moving forward. Family advocate offering family support group requires RSVP for head count
- David--60 slots wrap in form services will use CYF team build a village applied BH analysis, family therapy INV therapy, regression therapy, and TBS services. In home based Services-Victor has been doing Wrap Around. Has 1000 Wrap Around cases MHs Resource Specialist, parent and parent partner and Psychiatric Services available
- Sara Gavin/Kim-service we have provided through CommuniCare for a very long time- this is an expansion
 of those services. Closure of the Yolo Family Services Agency lead to the transition of 6 clinicians who
 came over from the organization to CommuniCare
- Wrap and School Service-Primary Individual, Group and Family-evidence based therapy, Cog Function, Eye
 Movement Desensitization, and Child Interaction (2-part time psychiatrists on staff). Wrap around-service
 to highest level of need problem and child welfare. Most intensive long-term lasting 12 to 18 months. 2-3
 time a week plus to meet the needs of the family.
- Stanford Youth Solutions-imbedded in child welfare component, two parent partners work with child
 Welfare Department and housed here in HHSA-CDA. Stanford has had 20 years of MH service in Sac
 County Wrap Flex Integrated Treatment. Mobile service focused. Family homes and schools in
 community. They will come to families and meet where family feels comfortable. Offer on-call and crisis
 stabilization. Core practice: Trauma Focused CBT, offering Center Treatment in conjunction with Stanford
 Chronic Abuse and Neglect CCT. Overseeing Parent and Youth Partnerships imbedded in this new modelworking on acquiring a location that's central to services.

Answer: Amara is discharge contact once child is inpatient. Access team will provide all population navigation of services including children. Assist with all placement regardless of age.

Other big thing happening-mandate that all children welfare youth be screened CAANS-had a gap for youth and child welfare. Oct 1st it will be done will all children. Robust tool that can help with CFT's. Program has really grown.

Meeting topic forward-fiscal staff representation to work through new contract questions, meetings that are fiscally focused. Fiscal workgroup for providers.
