MINUTES

The Yolo County Board of Supervisors met on the 23rd day of October, 2001 in regular session in the Woodland City Council Chambers located at Woodland City Hall, 300 First Street, Woodland, California at 9:00 A.M. pursuant to County Code Section 2-1.103.* Present were Supervisors Rosenberg, Pollock, McGowan, Wolk and Chair Stallard. Chair Stallard presided. Victor Singh, County Administrator and Steve Basha, County Counsel were present. Cheryl Boney, Deputy Director of Public Health Programs, led all in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Agenda Item No. 2 Public Comment
