4. PUBLIC COMMENT

• Elizabeth Abbott asked for an update on the Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) tour; and would like information on ORR before attending the tour.

5. STATE AND COUNTY UPDATE - Jill Cook, County Administrator's Office

- **County Budget:** On February 19, the Board of Supervisors held a budget workshop where departments shared prior accomplishments, their upcoming goals and challenges; and the Chief Budget Officer reported the general-purpose revenues are at an increase.
- **County Strategic Plan:** The public comment portion for community input closed on March 5th. The Strategic Plan Steering Committee will present the findings to the Board on March 26th.
- 6. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS UPDATE Tara Thronson, Assistant Deputy to Supervisor Saylor, District 2
 - **Hemp:** The Board has extended a moratorium on the cultivation of hemp in Yolo County, until more reasonable regulations are developed. There are also concerns about the uncertainty around odor, and cross pollination with other crops.
 - Office of Emergency Services: Is actively working on an evacuation plan for our community. The goal is to make future evacuations happen more quickly and effectively, and how to best evacuate those with access and functional needs and identify residents who need assistance with transportation services.

7. COMMUNITY HEALTH BRANCH REPORT – Brian Vaughn, Public Health Director Branch Report

- The President proposed his new budget which has many cuts to health and human services work across the board.
- FDA Director resigned which is a big loss, he was a champion of controlling the usage of electronic cigarettes by youths.
- The Governor appointed Dr. Mark Ghaly as his secretary for the California Health and Human Services Agency, who is a practicing pediatrician. Dr. Ghaly will focus largely on expanding Medi-Cal.
- Measles are in the news with three cases in the bay area. Facebook made an announcement that they are going to try to control and monitor anti-vaccination messaging.
- HHSA's current Strategic Plan, under Goal 1, we have completed two items that relates to the work in the Community Health Branch:
 - To work with 2 local jurisdictions to implement policies to improve community health and wellness for residents. We are currently working with the cities of Davis and West Sacramento on their flavored tobacco and try to ban the availability of flavor tobacco. The county already has an ordinance that bans flavored tobacco in the unincorporated areas, and now we are making a push to get the cities involved.
 - Achieve exclusive breastfeeding rates at hospital discharge that rank Yolo in the topo 10 percent of local health jurisdictions in California. Our WIC Program has been very successful in increasing breastfeeding rates, and we are one of the top two sites in the state to have breastfeeding at discharge, we are over 90 percent there.
- April is Child Abuse Prevention month

8. HEALTH OFFICER REPORT – Ron Chapman, Health Officer

- **Syphilis Taskforce:** The County submitted a three-year, \$300,000 CMSP grant for a Syphilis response. We have great support from around the table and letters of support. We should hear back at the beginning of April.
- **Preventive Medicine Resident**: CDPH runs a preventive medicine residency program. The first year you get your MPH, and the next two-years you do clinical work but placed in a health department. We received a call from the state asking if we are interested in having a preventive medicine resident. Met with the resident yesterday; the individual is also interviewing with other counties; but we are hoping it works out in our favor.
