Criminal Justice Grant Writing Group Updates - 05/13/19

The Criminal Justice Grant Writing Group had a meeting on 05-07-19 to discuss potential upcoming grants, as well as list the grants that were applied for during March and April of 2019, as well as decide upon which grants would be pursued during June 2019. The next meeting is on May 21, 2019, in which the group will discuss how to select and approach future grant applications in an effective and efficient manner.

The grants applied for during March and April 2019 included:

Adult Reentry Grant

- Administering Agency: Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC)
- <u>Lead Department/CBO for County:</u> CommuniCare
- Maximum Amount Available: \$500,000
- Term of Grant: 3 Years and 7 Months
- O Purpose of Grant: This will fund two positions at CommuniCare, which will be embedded at the Probation Department, to provide case management to individuals who are released from county or state prison for up to three months upon release and will include reentry planning prior to release. These staff will work directly with the new Probation Aide position that will be embedded within the local jail.
- Submission Deadline: 03/25/19

Youth Reinvestment Grant

- Administering Agency: Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC)
- <u>Lead Department/CBO for County:</u> Probation
- Maximum Amount Available: \$1,000,000 (90% pass through to a Community Based Organization)
- o Term of Grant: 3 Years and 7 Months
- O Purpose of Grant: These funds will be used to create a restorative justice diversion program at the pre- and post-filing stages, and will also be used to provide case management services and establish the Evening Learning Center program as components of the diversion. Target population will focus on felony level offenses. Current plan is to put these individual components out to bid, due to complications with sole sourcing procurement.
- o Submission Deadline: 03/29/19

• Proposition 47 – Cohort 2 Grant

- o Administering Agency: Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC)
- o <u>Lead Department/CBO for County:</u> Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA)
- Maximum Amount Available: \$6,000,000 (70% pass through to non-governmental organizations)
- o Term of Grant: 3 Years and 9 Months
- Purpose of Grant: These funds will be used to create an expansion of Steps to Success that focused specifically on the homeless population, with additional resources for housing services. This program will expand on Steps 2 Success' (S2S) eligibility criteria by allowing for diversion of individuals currently on formal felony probation, post-release community supervision, or mandatory supervision.
- o Submission Deadline: 03/18/19

Byrne Justice Assistance Grant

- Administering Agency: Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC)
- <u>Lead Department/CBO for County:</u> District Attorney (DA)
- o Maximum Amount Available: \$2,145,000
- o <u>Term of Grant:</u> 3 Years
- Purpose of Grant: Funds will be used to sustain and expand the existing Neighborhood Court program.
- Submission Deadline: 04/25/19

Incompetent to Stand Trial Diversion Grant

- o <u>Administering Agency:</u> California Department of State Hospitals (DSH)
- Lead Department/CBO for County: Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA)
- Maximum Amount Available: \$936,732
- Term of Grant: 3 Years
- Purpose of Grant: This grant would be used to fund the mandated AB 1810 mental health diversion programming.
- o Submission Deadline: 04/19/19

Community Services Infrastructure Grant

- Administering Agency: California Health Facilities Financing Authority, California State
 Treasurers Office
- <u>Lead Department/CBO for County:</u> CAO
- Maximum Amount Available: \$1,000,000
- o Term of Grant: Project must be completed and program running by 06/30/2022
- Purpose of Grant: This grant will be used to purchase 2 five-person houses for Yolo County criminal justice diversion programs, and expand access to mental health disorder/ substance use disorder treatment and life skill training by stabilizing their living situation and bringing treatment to them (instead of forcing them to seek transportation to treatment).
