4. PUBLIC COMMENT

- **Nicole Mion**: shared that Help Me Grow Yolo is in its 4th year. Alameda is the oldest county with Help Me Grow in California. Alameda recently did a study with Alameda Alliance for Health which is there Partnership. They did a efficacy study to see when kids who were brought in with Help Me Grow compared to kids who didn't come in with Help Me Grow. They found that kids that came in with Help Me Grow were accessing services for developmental disorders on average of 2 ½ years younger than kids that were coming in through the traditional medical system.
- Ahna Suleiman: Shared that she is part of the Sex Education Roundtable. The California Department of Education is trying to finalize sex education standards for the state. The instructional quality commission is in its final stages of approving these inclusive sex education guidelines, this will outline what kids learn in grades K-12. On May 8th there will be a final hearing. There has been a lot of opposition on the curriculum from religious groups. If you are interested in coming out supporting Ahna will send an email with additional information.

5. COMMUNITY HEALTH BRANCH REPORT – MCAH HIGHLIGHTS – Brian Vaughn

- **Brian Vaughn:** Shared that the MCAH Title V needs assessment is due in June. Anna is currently doing presentations. Anna will be presenting at YCCA, the local child care planning council, CommuniCare, and YCOE. If you would like Anna to come present to your agency, you can email Anna at Anna.Sutton@yolocounty.org. The Blue Dot Campaign for maternal mental health awareness week, they are rolling out a campaign with the local libraries. The national Mental Health Awareness week starts April 29th. On May 21st there will be a resolution for Mental Health month and Maternal Mental Health at the Board of Supervisors meeting. We are coming up on the end of our 3 year planning cycle for the Mental Health Services Act. If you are interested there will be community meetings. There will be a meeting on May 2nd. We received a grant for CMSP for \$300,000 to work on Syphilis. They are continuing to monitor the measles
- Laurie Somerhausen: Shared that WIC will be hosting a Mother's Day Tea Party on May 9th at 1:30. The WIC card will be coming out in Yolo September 23.
