# **MUCOSAL ATOMIZATION DEVICE (MAD)**

Adult Pediatric

### **Indications**

Patients without IV access who require urgent medication administration

### **Contraindications**

- Epistaxis
- Nasal trauma
- Nasal septal abnormalities
- Nasal congestion/discharge

#### **Procedure**

- Determine appropriate medication dose per applicable protocol
- Draw up medication into a syringe using appropriate transfer needle
- Purge air from syringe
- Place mucosal atomization device on the end of the syringe and screw into place
- Gently insert the atomizer into the nare, stop once resistance is met
- Rapidly administer the medication when patient fully exhales and before inhalation
- ADMINISTER 1/2 DOSE IN EACH NARE
- Do not exceed **1.0 mL** per nare
- Evaluate the effectiveness of the medication, if desired effect has not been achieved, consider repeating and/or changing route of administration

## **Approved Medications**

(See appropriate treatment protocol for dose)

## **BLS Local Scope**

Naloxone (Narcan)

#### **ALS**

- Glucagon
- Midazolam (Versed) 5mg/mL concentration required
- Fentanyl
- Ketamine (Ketalar)

#### Consider

- Nasal administration does not work for every patient
- Nasal administration is less likely to be effective if the patient has been abusing inhaled vasoconstrictors such as cocaine

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
