Platelet Aggregator Inhibitor Non-opioid analgesic

Action:

Aspirin blocks the formation of the substance thromboxane A₂, which causes platelets to aggregate and arteries to constrict.

Onset: 5-30 minutes Peak: 1-3 hours Duration: 3-6 hours

<u>Indications</u>: <u>Contraindications</u>:

Chest pain/discomfort suggestive of acute myocardial infarction

Severe hypersensitivity (anaphylaxis)

Side Effects:

GI: bleeding, nausea, vomiting

Notes:

 Aspirin should be given to all patients with suspected Acute Coronary Syndrome even if they have already taken their own.
