# **Medication Profile**

Nitroglycerin (Nitrostat, Nitrobid)

#### Class:

Antianginal Vasodilator

### Action:

Dilation of vascular smooth muscle.

Decrease peripheral arterial resistance (afterload).

Decrease in venous blood return (preload).

Decrease BP and workload on the heart with decreased O2 demand.

Redistribution of coronary blood flow (dilation) improving the supply of O<sub>2</sub> to the hypoxic area through collateral coronary vessels.

Onset: 1-5 minutes Peak: 1-5 minutes Duration: 10-60 minutes

## **Indications**:

#### **Contraindications:**

CHF/Pulmonary edema

Hypersensitivity/allergy
Increased intracranial pressure
Hypotension
Patients that have taken erectile dysfunction
medications within the past 24-hours. May
encounter patients taking similar
medications for pulmonary hypertension.
(Viagra, Cialis, Levitra, stendra, staxyn,
sildenafil, avanafil, tadalafil, vardenafil).

## Side Effects:

CV: Postural hypotension, tachycardia, CV collapse CNS: Headache, dizziness, flushing, vertigo, weakness

GI: Nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain INTEG: Pallor, sweating, rash, flushing

#### Notes:

- Protect from light, heat and moisture.
- Recheck BP after each administration.
