**9:00 A.M. CALL TO ORDER**

1. **WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS** – *Michael Wilkes, Health Council Chair*  
The July 11, 2019 Health Council meeting was called to order at 9:03 a.m., at which time around the table introductions occurred and quorum was confirmed.

4. **PUBLIC COMMENT**  
No public comments.
5. **STATE AND COUNTY UPDATE** – *Jill Cook, County Administrator’s Office*
  - **Cannabis:** In early September the county will release the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) proposed revised draft for the Cannabis Land Use Ordinance (CLUO). Between September and October there will be a sixty-day review period for the draft EIR and the draft CLUO.
  - **State Budget:** Assembly Bill 74 included \$60 million for the next two fiscal years to grant CBOs to assist consumers to get, keep, and use Medi-Cal and other health insurance programs.  
Governor Newsom signed Assembly Bill 104 that increases Medi-Cal eligibility for adults age 19 to 25 regardless of immigration status beginning July 1, 2019; and with the Assembly Bill 104 it corrects Yolo County’s status as a County Medical Services Program County, and now Yolo County will be receiving \$2 million in Public Health Realignment funding annually, starting this month.
6. **BOARD OF SUPERVISORS UPDATE** – *Supervisor Don Saylor, District 2*
  - **Strategic Plan:** The Board of Supervisors is working with all the department heads and through a lot of community engagement we are working on a new strategic plan. The current plan covers 2016-2019, so we are set to adopt an updated strategic plan for the county in December 2019 that will cover several years going forward. Here are a few of the upcoming workshops:
    - July 16<sup>th</sup> at the Winters Library from 9:00am–2:00pm, the focus will be on Environmental Sustainability, Agriculture, Economy, and Infrastructure.

- August 13<sup>th</sup> from 9:00am–2:00pm, the focus will be on Public Safety, Criminal Justice, Reform Juvenile Justice Issues. The location is being finalized.

Workshops are public meetings, and everyone is welcome to attend.

- **Rural Fires:** At the July 23<sup>rd</sup> Board meeting, we will be talking about the rural fires and the Emergency Response capacity in Yolo County.

**7. COMMUNITY HEALTH BRANCH REPORT – *Brian Vaughn, Public Health Director***

- **County Medical Services Program (CMSP) Funding:** Starting to put together a budget plan for the funds we will be receiving. Here are some of the ideas we have been discussing:
  - Health in All Policies – put some funding behind it so we can implement it countywide.
  - Equity and Health Equity – figure out how we cultivate and think of innovation around health in the priority areas in the County; and think about being a partner and having a presence in those areas and working with the community to help develop new projects.
  - Communicable Disease Programs – Our disease programs have been greatly underfunded in our work and with STDs on the rise, we also need to put money to investigate current cases; but also have some funds for prevention work.
  - Chronic Disease – We currently do not have staff working on chronic disease such as diabetes or heart disease. We have some obesity funding, but we can also use some of these funds to expand the work there as well.

Once the budget plan is finalized and approved by the Board, Brian will share the information with the Health Council.

- **Fire Season:** Fire season has started, so we are making a big push internally regarding our emergency preparedness efforts to train staff at all levels of HHSA. We have developed a curriculum that we will start engaging our agency staff and boost up our emergency preparedness efforts. We are also working with PG&E about rolling blackouts, and the effects and unintended consequences.
- **Community Health Needs Assessment:** At our October or November meeting, we would like to give a presentation on the Community Health Needs Assessment that we did with the hospitals so you can see the findings. The hospitals are in the process of proving and publishing the information, and once we get the go ahead, then we would like to bring that conversation here.
- **Mental Health Services Act (MHSA):** The Community Health Branch is helping and assisting with the community planning around the MHSA and the planning process. An Educational Session, the third of a three-part series, will be tonight in West Sacramento to talk about program evaluation and results. In September we will start having community planning meetings to start developing the new 3-year plan. Information will be shared once the date has been finalized. We would like to see participation across the Health Council, due to the intersection of health and mental health.

**8. HEALTH OFFICER REPORT – *Ron Chapman, Health Officer***

- **California Department of Public Health (CDPH):** Dr. Karen Smith is no longer working as the Director of California Public Health, and not sure who is the acting director as of today.
- **Preventive Medicine Resident:** Ron Chapman introduced Dr. Alanna Bares. Dr. Bares is a Board-Certified Pediatrician and just completed her Master's in Public Health from UC Davis. Dr. Bares will be training with Yolo County Public Health for the next two-years for her preventive medicine residency program.

- **Syphilis Task Force:** At the next task force meeting, HHSAs Substance Abuse Administrator, Ian Evans, will be facilitating a 90-minute session, using a technique to analyze how the system cares for people with Syphilis in our county and how they touch a variety of organizations around the county.
- **Tuberculosis:** We have four new active cases in the last month, two within the last week. We want to get the word out to healthcare systems and providers to be thinking about any respiratory illness for the potential of Tuberculosis.

**9. HEALTH COUNCIL ELECTION OF CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR – Brian Vaughn, Public Health Director**

Brian Vaughn thanked Dr. Wilkes for his many years of service as the Health Council’s Chair.

Brian announced there are two candidates, one for the Chair position and one for the Vice-chair position. Brian reminded everyone that the candidate’s background information was handed out at the June 13<sup>th</sup> Health Council meeting. Brian asked the candidates to step out of the room for the discussion and votes.
