#### Featured: Gibson Girl

Etchings and prints by Charles Dana Gibson (1867-1944) of glamorous, upper class women became very popular during the 1890s. The "Gibson Girl" was recognized as the ideal female in late 19th and early 20th century. These prints often depicted women as teasing companions to men with undertones of female empowerment; however, they lacked the political implications of the "new woman" that accompanied first wave feminism. The "Gibson Girl" was a contrast to the image of women in the suffragette movement, which is the focus of the Votes 4 Women exhibition opening on March 12th 2020 at the Gibson House and Property.
