Reductions in recycling markets and strict limits on contamination mean recycling right has never been more important. You can help by only putting the items identified above in your curbside recycling bin. Contaminants (waste placed in the wrong bin) slow the sorting process and result in shutdowns of entire sorting facilities. Top problematic recycling contaminants include “tanglers” such as cord, hose, wire, and plastic bags that easily get tangled in the cogs and belts at sorting facilities.

Some materials not accepted for recycling through curbside collection, are reusable or recyclable through other options. Contact your local program for information on other recycling options. See the back of this calendar for contact information.

JANUARY

TIP OF THE MONTH: Lose the bag! Plastic bags can clog sorting belts and conceal contaminants. Place recyclables loose and un-bagged in the cart.

FOOD SCRAPS



Fruits, Vegetables, Bread, Pasta, Meat, Fish, Bones, Cheese, Coffee Grounds, Egg Shells

FOOD-SOILED PAPER



Paper Towels, Napkins, Coffee Filters, Greasy Pizza Boxes, and Non-plastic Coated Paper Plates

YARD TRIMMINGS



Grass, Plants, Wood Chips, Tree and Landscape Trimmings, Brush, and Leaves

Many Yolo County communities now offer curbside collection of organic waste, including food scraps, yard trimmings, and food-soiled paper! These materials are made into rich soil amendments and biofuel products, which helps reduce greenhouse gas emissions. To find out about the organic waste collection service options in your neighborhood, contact your local program coordinator. See the back page of this calendar for contact information.

FEBRUARY

TIP OF THE MONTH: Keep your organics cart clean and free of pests by placing food scraps in something compostable before placing them in the organics cart. Wrap your scraps in junk mail or newspaper, put them in a cereal box, or use a compostable bag—your choice. Please remember, Biodegradable Plastic DOES NOT EQUAL Compostable Plastic. If you bag your organic waste, use paper bags or bags labeled as Compostable.

Extending the useful life of tools, products, furniture, and equipment extends the useful life of the landfill while reducing resource waste.

THE BIG BLUE RECYCLING BARN

Save money and prevent waste by donating and shopping for gently used items at the Yolo County Central Landfill Big Blue Recycling Barn. Donations of the following gently used items are accepted daily during normal business hours: furniture, exercise equipment, electronics, children's toys, bicycles, doors, windows, patio furniture, and more! The Big Blue Recycling Barn is open one Friday and Saturday each month (see the Blue Barn on calendar pages for actual dates). All items are 50% off on Saturdays in March, June, September and December.



CLOTHING DONATIONS

While the Big Blue Recycling Barn Thrift Store doesn't accept and sell clothes and textiles, most local thrift stores do! Check the back pages of this calendar for a list of local thrift stores. Some charities, homeless shelters, or support groups also accept clothing donations.

CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION DEBRIS RECYCLING

California's Green Building Standards Code (CALGreen) requires a minimum of 65% of all nonhazardous construction and demolition waste be recycled and/or salvaged for reuse for all covered projects. Visit HCD.ca.gov/Building-Standards/CalGreen for more information.

CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION (C&D) DEBRIS RECYCLING

Yolo County Central Landfill accepts separated or mixed C&D materials for recycling, including but not limited to:

- ✓ Clean Wood
- ✓ Drywall
- ✓ Metals
- ✓ Concrete
- ✓ Rigid plastics
- ✓ Porcelain tile

- ✓ Cardboard

TREATED WOOD



Pressure treated wood, PCP treated wood, and railroad ties contain hazardous chemicals and may NOT be disposed of as trash or recycled with regular wood. Contact the Yolo County Central Landfill for hazardous waste disposal options. See the back of this calendar for contact information.

APRIL

TIP OF THE MONTH: The Yolo County Landfill offers a wide range of reclaimed wood for purchase. Wood chips (mulch) in natural and dyed colors, cut firewood, and miscellaneous lumber is available at discounted rates. For more information call (530) 666-8727 or visit www.YoloCounty.org/Landfill.

GOT *UNWANTED* MEDS?

Accidental or improper use of medication is the leading cause of poisoning in the U.S. Don't let unused medications build up in your in home, and **NEVER** pour them down the drain or flush them down your toilet.

USE THE KIOSK PROGRAM AND FOLLOW THESE STEPS TO SAFELY DISPOSE OF UNWANTED MEDS.

STEP 1: CHECK FOR ACCEPTABILITY

✓ Accepted:

- Over-the-counter medications
- Pet medications
- Prescription medications
- Controlled substances

✗ Not accepted:

- Illegal substances
- Medicinal marijuana
- Medical sharps, needles, lancets and EpiPens
- Inhalers and aerosols.

STEP 2: PREPARE FOR DROP-OFF

- Remove or blackout your information on the label.
- Place pills in a clear bag. Recycle the container.
- Keep liquids and creams in their original container and seal them tightly.



SHARPS:

It is illegal to throw needles, lancets and other "sharps waste" in the trash. Keep sanitation workers safe by disposing of sharps as hazardous waste. Place used sharps in a rigid plastic container (such as a detergent bottle), close the lid tightly, tape it shut, and write "Sharps Waste" on the container. Bring the sealed and marked container to the Yolo County Central Landfill HHW Drop-Off Facility for safe disposal, open every Friday and Saturday, 7:30am to 3:30pm.

AGRICULTURAL RECYCLING RESOURCES

DRIP TAPE

Drip tape can be recycled at the Yolo County Central Landfill if it is bundled, rolled or coiled, and free of large amounts of dirt and plant material (fees apply).

❌ Drip hose is not accepted for recycling.

PESTICIDE CONTAINERS

Yolo County offers free recycling of pesticide containers that have been certified by the Yolo County Agriculture Department as meeting the Department of Toxic Substance Control (DTSC) "empty container" guidelines: This requires the removal of all SDS packets, labels, foil, and caps and that each container is triple rinsed.

Once completed, contact the Yolo County Agriculture Department to request certification by calling (530) 666-8140. Certified pesticide containers are accepted for free recycling at the Yolo County Central Landfill every Friday between 7:30am and 3:30 pm.

TIRES

Tires can be recycled at the Yolo County Landfill every day (fees apply).

In West Sacramento, residents can recycle up to 4 tires per load through the bulky waste collection appointment service. Call (866) 844-1508 for more information.



JULY

TIP OF THE MONTH: Dumping used motor oil on the ground, down the drain, or in the trash contaminates both soil and water. Protect our valuable agricultural lands by recycling used motor oil at any of the 14 used oil recycling sites in Yolo County—see the back pages of the calendar. Many of these locations accept used oil filters for recycling too!

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW)



It is illegal to dispose of hazardous waste in your trash or recycle bins. Household hazardous waste includes auto fluids, batteries, propane cylinders, cleaning products, flammable liquids, mercury thermometers, paint, pesticides, syringes, and other toxic and/or corrosive household products.

The Yolo County Central Landfill offers residents free disposal of household hazardous waste every Friday and Saturday, from 7:30 AM to 3:30 PM. Senior and disabled Yolo County residents who are unable to drive may call (530) 666-8856 or (916) 617-4656 to schedule a pick-up appointment. Visit www.YoloCounty.org/Landfill for more information.

West Sacramento residents may call (800) 449-7587 to schedule up to two HHW collection appointments per fiscal year (July 1 through June 30).

AUGUST

TIP OF THE MONTH: You can save money and reduce waste by purchasing a refillable propane cylinder instead of buying multiple of the single-use type. Up to 80% of the cost of a single-use cylinder is for the cylinder itself, not the propane gas.



SEPTEMBER

TIP OF THE MONTH: Save money by purchasing LED bulbs. At the time of purchase, LED bulbs appear to be more expensive than incandescent and fluorescent bulbs. However, when you consider that they help to reduce energy costs, and they have a much longer projected useful life than other bulbs (often up to 20 years), LED bulbs are the least expensive of these 3 types of bulbs.

MANDATORY RECYCLING REQUIREMENTS FOR BUSINESSES AND APARTMENTS

State law may require your business to recycle:

STATE ASSEMBLY BILL 341

The Mandatory Commercial Recycling law requires businesses that generate 4 or more cubic yards of solid waste weekly and apartment properties with five or more units to have a recycling program.

STATE ASSEMBLY BILL 1826

The Mandatory Organic Recycling law requires businesses that generates 4 or more cubic yards of solid waste each week, to recycle their organic waste. Apartment properties with 5 or more units that generate 4 cubic yards or more of solid waste weekly are required to recycle their landscape trimmings.

For the purposes of these State mandated recycling requirements, solid waste includes ALL generated waste: trash, organics and recycling. The State defines organic waste as food waste, food-soiled paper, landscape trimmings, and non-hazardous wood waste. Contact your local recycling program or your waste service provider to learn more about the service options available in your jurisdiction.
