February Programs at the Davis Branch Library

(Woodland, CA) – Escape the cold and cozy up with the following programs held during the month of February at the Mary L. Stephens Davis Branch Library, located at 315 E. 14th Street in Davis:

- **February is Black History Month!** 2020 marks the 100th anniversary of the 19th Amendment and the women's suffrage movement and the 150th anniversary of the 15th Amendment and the right of black men to vote. This year's theme, "African Americans and the Vote," recognizes the ongoing struggle of voting for black men and women. Check out displays and pick up a special bookmark.
- February 1, 8, 15, 22 & 29: FREE Income Tax Return Help (Teen Room), 10:00 a.m. Get help preparing your 2019 Income Tax Return.
