Situation Update:

Actions Requested of Healthcare Systems and Clinicians:

1. **MASK** all patients with respiratory symptoms immediately upon arrival at your facility.
2. **IDENTIFY ALL** individuals with the following clinical features or epidemiologic risk:

Clinical Features	&	Epidemiologic Risk
Fever (subjective or confirmed) or signs/symptoms of lower respiratory illness (e.g. cough or shortness of breath)	AND	Any person, including healthcare workers, who has had close contact with a laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 patient within 14 days of symptom onset
Fever (subjective or confirmed) and signs/symptoms of a lower respiratory illness (e.g., cough or shortness of breath) requiring hospitalization	AND	A history of travel from affected geographic areas below, within 14 days of symptom onset: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • China • Iran • Italy • Japan • South Korea
Fever (subjective or confirmed) with severe acute lower respiratory illness (e.g., pneumonia, ARDS) requiring hospitalization and without alternative explanatory diagnosis (e.g., influenza) ⁶ No source of exposure has been identified	AND	No source of exposure has been identified

Triage for PUI Evaluation	
•	History of travel to China, Iran, Italy, Japan, or South Korea: <ul style="list-style-type: none">○ City and province or state of travel○ Departure date○ United States arrival date○ Were they screened at a US airport?
•	Did have close contact with someone diagnosed with COVID-19?
•	Have you had extensive and close contact with vulnerable patients in healthcare settings?
•	Symptoms: <ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Fever?○ Respiratory? (Cough, Shortness of Breath)
•	Where is the patient currently? <ul style="list-style-type: none">○ City of residence○ Home/Hospital/At the clinic

4. **CONTACT Yolo County** BY PHONE 24/7 to discuss patients in Yolo County meeting CDC criteria for individuals who need additional evaluation to rule out novel coronavirus (COVID-19).
 - The Yolo County Public Health and your agency Infection Preventionist phone numbers should be **posted** where any TRIAGE or APPOINTMENT SCHEDULING is occurring.
 - Fax completed Confidential Morbidity Report (CMR) to the confidential fax line **(530) 669-1549**.
