Subject: Lifting of Influenza Masking Mandate

SITUATION UPDATE:

Flu-positive labs dropped dramatically in the week ending March 21. In addition, there is increasing need for masks for Covid-19 PPE and a worsening mask shortage. Therefore, Yolo County is lifting the influenza masking mandate as of today, March 25, 2020.

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Actions Requested of Health Care Systems and Clinicians:

- 1. **Continue to report** electronically to Yolo County, via CalREDIE or confidential fax at (530) 669-1549, the following laboratory-confirmed influenza cases:
 - Intensive care unit (ICU) cases of all ages
 - Deaths of all ages
 - Novel influenza viruses regardless of age, hospitalization, or vital status
 - Outbreaks (1 lab-confirmed, and at least one other ILI)

Medical records (e.g., admission notes, laboratory results, discharge summary, vaccination information) for **all** ICU and fatal cases should be uploaded into the CalREDIE filing cabinet or sent via confidential fax to (5630) 669-1549.

- 2. Implement infection control precautions as appropriate.
- 3. **Treat** with antivirals (e.g., oseltamivir, zanamivir, peramivir) as early as possible any patient confirmed or suspected to have influenza who: is hospitalized; has severe, complicated, or progressive illness; or is at higher risk for influenza complications.
- 4. **Continue to offer** influenza vaccination for any patient six months of age and older without contraindications to the vaccine.
- 5. **Ensure** ill health care workers remain home and do not go to work.
