



Develop and enforce a specific COVID-19 worksite plan that's implemented by a Compliance Manager.



Post signs, visual cues, or partitions and/or redesign spaces to meet social distancing protocols.



Actively urge sick employees to stay home.

Symptom— or temp-check staff and/or volunteers daily.



Disinfect counters, equipment, etc. on a daily basis.



Train staff on health and safety procedures.



Limit the number of people in a dining room, meeting space, or lounge area.



Encourage contactless payment or paperwork or decrease handling of paper, cash, etc.



Promote telework options and modified work schedules, if applicable.



Provide hand sanitizer or wipes while advocating for good hygiene.



Have all staff wear a face covering while working or interacting with the public.



Your Responsibility to Our Community



Keep the health of our community as a priority.



Wear a face covering as mandated in the Yolo County Health Order, which is in effect until further notice.



Practice social distancing and stay 6 feet away from others not a part of your household.



Stay home if sick or if others in your household are sick they need to stay home.



Continue to practice good hygiene like washing hands with soap and water and covering coughs.



Follow directions on posted signage or visual cues and adhere to requirements in the business.



Limit what you touch in stores, restaurants, offices, or businesses. Don't spread germs!



Avoid hugs, handshakes or close contact with others not in your household.



Continue to stay at home as much as possible until stay at home orders are lifted by the County and the State.



High-risk populations need to stay home until Stage 4.
