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## **State Testing Site Moves to West Sacramento June 2**

(Woodland, CA) – As planned, following four weeks of testing residents for novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in Woodland, the State testing facility in Yolo County will be moving to West Sacramento for the next three weeks, from June 2–June 20. Appointments will be available Tuesdays – Saturdays from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Testing is by appointment only and can be made by calling (888) 634-1123 or completing an online application at: <a href="https://lhi.care/covidtesting">https://lhi.care/covidtesting</a>. The address of the testing site will be provided upon completion of the application. Testing is open to anyone in the community, including agricultural workers, the homeless, undocumented employees, and residents. If residents do not have health insurance, the cost of the test will be covered by the state. If residents have health insurance, their provider will be billed with no out of pocket cost to the resident.

"Hundreds of Yolo County residents have taken advantage of the opportunity to receive free COVID-19 testing. Now residents of Broderick, Bryte and West Sacramento will enjoy the same access to free testing," said Yolo County Board Chair Gary Sandy. "Expanded testing coupled with contact tracing is pivotal to a safe and healthy re-opening for our community."

Please note this is not antibody testing; this is to test if individuals currently have COVID-19. Children under the age of 12 will not be tested at this location due to health and safety reasons. Residents must wear a face covering to their appointment and practice social distancing. This location is not a drive-thru so residents will need to park their car and walk a short distance to the building. It is also recommended for residents to verify appointment details the day before by logging back into their account. OptumServe will be able to test up to 135 people a day with test results available within 48 to 72 hours.

"As we move further into Stage 2 of reopening, it is important to continue to make strides in testing as many residents as possible," said Yolo County Board Supervisor Oscar Villegas. "Proceeding with the plan to move the State testing site to West Sacramento allows the County to partner with the City of West Sacramento as they host these next three weeks of continued voluntary testing and I encourage our community to take advantage of this opportunity."

Yolo County is one of 80 community testing sites across the state focused on underserved communities, provided by the State of California Testing Task Force in conjunction with OptumServe.
