9:00 A.M. CALL TO ORDER

The October 8, 2020 Health Council meeting was called to order at 9:03 a.m. by Evan Priestley, Health Council Chair.

- 4. STATE AND COUNTY UPDATE Jill Cook, County Administrator's Office
 - **County:** On September 29th, the Board of Supervisors adopted the final 2020-21 budget. Balancing strategies along with health and human services revenue (realignment) and the CARES Act funding for our COVID response we were able to bring the budget in for a soft landing.
- 5. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS UPDATE Supervisor Don Saylor, District 2
 - Davis 2x2x2: On October 7th, City of Davis, UC Davis, and Yolo County met to discuss COVID related issues. UC Davis students have moved in and COVID testing is still happening. There is concern across the county that this might become an issue and affect where we are in the tiers; but so far this has not become an issue. City of Davis and Yolo County are in constant communication with UC Davis leadership team regarding COVID related issues.
- 6. COMMUNITY HEALTH BRANCH UPDATE Brian Vaughn, Public Health Director

7. HEALTH OFFICER REPORT – Brian Vaughn, Public Health Director

• **COVID:** Last week we moved into from the purple to the red tier. Based on our case rate and case positivity rate we qualified to move down to the next tier; and based on our matrix we may qualify for the yellow tier. We have to maintain or be in a tier for at least three weeks before we can move on, so if we maintain the same rates that we have now we will be qualified to go into the yellow tier on October 20th. We continue to work closely with UC Davis around their Healthy Davis Together Project, and things are starting to come together. They are going to invest in some additional testing in Davis as they ramp up their own testing strategy, and we are working with them on contact tracing. Good news is that we have not seen a spike in cases with students, and they have done a significant number of tests; but we will be monitoring that to see if there is any impact on our ability to move through the tiers.
