Yolo County is Vaccinating Seniors 75+



Starting February 2021, Yolo County will be vaccinating residents 75+ because they are the most vulnerable out of those who are 65+. The County will first focus on the most underserved areas based on socio-economic vulnerability.



A COVID-19 vaccine given to someone 75 and older is 3 times more likely to save a life than a vaccine given to someone 65-74. The limited doses the County's received must be focused on saving lives. The County will broaden to 65+ once more doses are available.
