How do the arts benefit California's economy?

Nonprofit arts contribute more than \$5.4 billion to California's economy and nearly \$300 million in state and local tax revenues. Arts and culture in California are strong attractions for tourists, generating nearly \$360 million in annual spending. For every dollar spent producing arts events, \$11 is spent on transportation, lodging, dining, shopping, parking and other ancillary spending.

Promoting the arts and creativity in our schools helps build a base of creative thinkers and problem solvers better prepared for employment in the global information age – key components of a healthy workforce that can compete with overseas labor markets.

The presence of the arts in communities increases home values, which results in higher local tax bases and directly benefits our children's schools.
