Yolo County – Ramin Yazdani

Organic Waste/Composting/Anaerobic Digestion Update:

In-Vessel Digester project update:

<u>Food depackager</u>- Depackager testing was successfully completed in October and waiting for approval to start operation.

<u>Electrical Control Panel for In-Vessel Digester Project</u>- Bid was released in October and due next week.

Anaerobic Composter Operation (Composting Facility #1)

Annual emissions source testing was completed and report due to in December.

<u>Organics Agreements with Cities</u> – County emailed agreement to all cities and now working on Sacramento County agreement.

<u>Future C&D Recycling and Composting Facility#2 (Northern Recycling)</u>- Design of the C&D Recycling and Composting Facility #2 is under way. Construction will start in Spring 2021 and is projected to be completed and ready for operation by July 2022.

Landfill Module Closure:

Closure of Waste Management Units 4 & 5-Project construction is complete and board of supervisor will approve completion in December.

Landfill Environmental Impact Report (EIR):

County staff continue to work with consultant on the landfill EIR.

Yolo County – Marissa Juhler

Our "Avoid the Spark" Campaign began December 1st to educate residents about the
importance of proper battery disposal and the fire risks associated with batteries. Flyers
are being distributed through the scale house and Esparto Transfer Station as well as
social media outlets by all cities and county. County staff is also working on a direct
mailer to all rural residents asking that they affix a provided sticker label to their trash and
recycling carts to remind them that batteries due not go in their carts. A follow up article to

- the latest landfill fire will also be printed in December by the Davis Enterprise. (see attached)
- Due to COVID closures at YCCL and ECC, the County is giving a free pass to those on the self-haul exemption program during the time these sites were closed. No make up trash runs are required.
- Appointment based Big Blue Barn Thrift Store events are being pushed to January 2021.
- At the November 17th BOS meeting, it was approved to move forward with putting an appliance recycling rate increase on the master fee list for January 1, 2021. Standard appliances such as washers, dryers and stoves will go from \$6/unit to \$8/unit and unit with Freon such as refrigerators, freezers and AC Units will go from \$6/unit to \$12/unit. These rate increases are comprised of general annual labor increases, increase equipment and fuel cost to stage appliances for servicing and the new requirement to service units onsite before transport for the removal of all hazardous waste (Freon, bulbs, batteries, capacitors, circuit boards, etc.)
- Reminder Under the new franchise agreements, annual rate increases fall in January each year now instead of July. January 1, 2021 will mark 12 months since the start of the new agreements.
- Pressure Treated Wood regulatory changes are confirmed to go into effect on January 1, 2021 and therefore rates will increase significantly for all. The industry has still yet to establish a plan for where this material will go.

Davis – Richard Tsai

 December 1 - city council approved revisions to the C&D ordinance which will be effective in 30 days.

West Sacramento - Paulina Benner

- On November 19, 2020, the city released a request for proposals for consultant services to assist with SB 1383 Compliance. Proposals are due on December 11, 2020.
- On November 12, 2020, CalRecycle staff informed the city that they decided to not send
 a formal letter request for the City's mandatory commercial organics recycling compliance
 plan and will instead keep the city in its current informal compliance status.

 Issues with COVID-19 cases with hauler. Working with WM on green waste and street sweeping.

UC Davis - Michael Fan

- READ facility Campus is exploring the possibility of installing a depackager unit to accommodate feedstock with higher contamination. We are also looking at the feasibility of installing a generator that converts biogas and landfill gas to electricity.
- UCD Medical Center Waste Similar to other efforts where the Davis and Sacramento campuses work together, we are evaluating the option of managing their solid waste service (refuse, organic waste and recyclables) including hauling and disposal. There is no specific timeline but, if everything goes well, we hope to have an agreement in place by spring 2021.
