Approval of Agenda: The committee voted to approve the agenda, 4-0.

**Public Comment:** Richard Lauckhart spoke about his goals and feelings about the CSA.

**Update from the Office of Yolo County Supervisor:** Richard Reed gave no updates but was on stand-by to field questions during the entire meeting.

**Approval of the November 2020 Meeting Minutes:** The committee did not vote to approve the minutes of the last meeting due to lack of a quorum.

**Municipal Survey Review and Sphere of Influence:** Christine Crawford updated the committee on these two functions of LAFCO. Also discussed: creation of LAFCO, independence from counties, Yolo County's 47 special districts, authority to recommend only, cannot require changes by districts, the 7 determinants, annexation of Stille's property into CSA. LAFCO estimates the MSR and SOI will be ready by the June LAFCO meeting.

**Discussion and Action Items: Median Project**. (Lien)Project should be completed in 1-2 months. There are just 1.5 medians left to complete (Country Club Circle & Lakeview Circle) Tim Lien discussed the **sewer flow study project** which has been put on hold due to covid-19 and increased household size as students move back home. **Financial Report:** Tricia Valenzuela gave a financial update. She discussed the Oaks street slurry project which still needs 2 bids and is currently roughly estimated to cost \$35,000. The EM3 well upgrade project finished \$15,000. over budget. BOS will consider an adjustment. The **218 process for streets** was reviewed by Patricia Valenzuela and Tim Lien. The assessment increase failed The fee remains at the previous level of \$180, annually, per household. The **Oaks Street Slurry Project:** Tim Lien motioned to recommend the BOS move ahead with this project. Motion passed 4-0. **Landscape Maintenance:** Diane Cronan is following this project and is satisfied with the progress.
