4. Regular Agenda

a) SB 1383 Food Rescue update – Marissa Juhler

The jurisdictions are continuing to work on SB 1383 Food Rescue efforts and will next be finalizing Tier 1 generator posters that can be universally used in all jurisdictions by recycling staff as well as Yolo County Environmental Health.

b) CIWMP Update – Marissa Juhler

The cities and county agreed that there are no major changes that need to be addressed in the Countywide Integrated Waste Management Plan 5-Year Review. Each jurisdiction provides Cal

Recycle their updates through the Electronic Annual Report. Marissa is in the process of finalizing edits to the document and should have a draft ready for review at our April or May WAC meeting.

c) Budget 2021/2022 – Ramin Yazdani This year's budget will be going to the Board of Supervisors after it's been reviewed by the Department of finance. See attached copy of rate increases which will be effective July 1, 2021.

Member Updates

Yolo County - Ramin Yazdani

- The composting facility construction started March of 2021.
- Anaerobic Composter has been in operation now for more than a year. The landfill has been producing compost and marketing to sell to farmers.
- The In-Vessel Digester is still waiting for approval from Water Board.
- In-vessel Digester construction will be continuing through this year.

Yolo County - Marissa Juhler

• Each year the County is responsible for submitting an Electronic Waste Net Cost Report to Cal Recycle on program costs and trends. For calendar year 2020, we collected and processed 8,676 televisions and computer monitors, also known as Covered Electronic Waste (CEW), which totaled 352,835 lbs. Here is the breakdown by jurisdiction: (Davis) 3,009 units, (West Sac) 1,226 units, (Winters) 257 units, (Woodland) 3,075 units, (Unincorporated Yolo) 599 units and (UCD) 23 units. This is only slightly down from 2019 when we collected 8,874 units. An additional 313 units were collected out at the Esparto Transfer Station from rural residents. After a revision to the state payment rate last July, the County, for the first time in 13 years, was able to fully cover costs for the CEW portion of our e-waste program at \$0.26/lb.
