WHAT INFORMATION WILL HELP THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS UNDERSTAND THE IMPORTANCE OF YOUR COMMUNITY IN THE REDISTRICTING PROCESS?

When documenting your community it is important to address the following questions to assist the Board of Supervisors in the redistricting process:

1. Does your community have a shared culture, characteristics, or bond?
2. Is your community geographic in nature? Is your community able to be mapped? Is there density within your community?
3. Describe your community's relationship with the County and how it is affected by policy decisions made by the Board of Supervisors.

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO FURTHER PARTICIPATE IN THE REDISTRICTING PROCESS?

1.
