Having attended a community meeting in Esparto, I wish to bend your ear with my opinion on this critical issue.

I am well aware of redistricting in California and Yolo County. My residence in this county dates back a score and ten years. This is not my first go around on this subject. I must first tell you that your parameters are on the ludicrous side of logic. In government today, most things move on politics. For decades, Woodland, West Sacramento, and Davis have prospered to the detriment of the rest of the county. The supervisors deny housing development in rural Yolo County, they build out Woodland, Davis, and West Sacramento instead. This puts all of rural Yolo County under the thumb of those three cities.

What commonality does Woodland, West Sacramento, and Davis have in common? Woodland is commerce, industry, and housing. Davis is education, commerce, industry, and housing. West Sacramento is transportation, commerce, and industry. Rural Yolo County is agricultural small business.

I can see the commonality of our 3 largest cities, but none with rural Yolo. This has led to Woodland, West Sacramento, and Davis holding all 5 seats of our Supervisors Board. You will find the cutouts into our most populous cities result in political parties backing the candidate in the cutout. Your choices could correct this, but not in the way you are approaching this. Rural Yolo County will continue to be the red-headed step child of the county and treated as such. If true leaders were elected and not political hacks, rural Yolo County wouldn't have a problem with not having a representative, but that is not today's government.

I point you to rural Yolo County's rather skimpy internet coverage. Woodland, Davis, and West Sacramento don't understand copper line speed of phone lines, lack of signal towers and the effects on remote education. They don't have to, they have full coverage.

In this pandemic, our Supervisors were made aware of this internet problem and to this date they have done nothing. Our school district is looking to buy our own towers to provide to our school district. This is what your redistricting efforts will enforce and encourage from Yolo County, the status quo is what I expect. It's the only way Woodland, Davis, and West Sacramento can continue to fund themselves. I feel the choices you limit yourselves to will result in status quo only and is a discouragement to good governance.
