## NOTE:

Reclamation District 2093 has minimal activity and in recent years has only been incurring expenses related to legal representation and auditing the District's records. RD 2093 voted in January 2006 to contract with the Solano County Auditor-Controller for auditing the districts fiscal years 2003-04 and 2004-05. Beginning with fiscal year 2005-06, TPL requested (and was granted) a five-year audit cycle by the Solano County Board of Supervisors.

Liberty Island has had major levee breaches and has been in a flooded state for over a decade. The island is almost entirely owned by The Trust for Public Land; there are two other private landowners within RD 2093. The Trust for Public Land purchased its property in 1998 with CALFED funding. The land was intended to be a part of the proposed US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) North Delta National Wildlife Refuge, but the refuge was not established and the property has been maintained through private ownership by The Trust for Public Land ever since.

<u>Board Meetings</u>: As needed. Board members have met several times a year over the past several years.
