Yolo Bypass West Levee Culvert Replacement Project Funding Options (as of 1/23/2022)

Background:

The Outfall Channel is a storm drainage transmission canal (shown in Exhibit A) that conveys drainage from the City of Woodland and portions of the County to the Yolo Bypass. It is located east of the City, south of the Cache Creek Settling Basin, and north of County Road 22. The Outfall Channel has three 48-inch diameter corrugated metal culverts constructed around 1981. The culverts are corroded and partially collapsed.

The culvert's operation and maintenance are covered by Agreement 71-518 which was an agreement made in 1971 to which the City and County are parties with state agencies. This agreement establishes the County having some obligation for replacement of the culverts.

City and County engineering staff reviewed two different methods looking at the drainage areas and culvert capacity to arrive at a method of cost allocation. Based on this method, it was determined the County should be responsible for 26% of the cost while the City is responsible for 74% of the cost.

Project Costs:

The project cost was budgeted by the City based on 65% construction documents at \$3,800,000 which includes a 20% contingency. The City will have bid documents back in early February 2022 which will confirm this number; however, at a 26% share the County would be responsible for \$988,000 in costs related to the project. Actuals may be lower if contingency isn't fully expended.

Staff presented the information at the December 16, 2021 Committee on Capital Investment (CCI) meeting. The members of the committee were supportive of the project but wanted to see staff analysis on funding options and recommendations before the item proceeded to the full Board of Supervisors (anticipated for February 2022 as part of Mid-Year Budget revisions).

Funding Options:

Based on staff reviewing the options for funding, it was determined that there are four different possible funding sources for this project (listed by most restrictive):

- 2017 Capital Improvement Bond Proceeds
- American Rescue Plan Act
- Accumulated Capital Outlay (ACO) Funds
- Capital Improvement Reserves
- General Fund

The County does not charge any drainage specific fees in this area to accumulate funds for the replacement. The County also reviewed the eligibility of use of Roads funds for this purpose and determined that was not an allowable funding source.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommend utilizing the most restrictive funding source that would be eligible for the project. The 2017 Capital Improvement Bond Proceeds were issued in that year to fund four projects (Historic Courthouse, Library Archives, Monroe Detention Expansion, and the Leinberger Jail project). After closing out the Monroe project in December 2021, it was determined that there is an additional \$1.1 million in unexpended bond proceeds that would generally need to be expended within five years of bond issuance (August 2022) and thus this project is timed to meet that need. If the Committee is supportive, staff would bring to full Board as part of February midyear budget item.
