9:00 A.M. CALL TO ORDER

The January 13, 2022 Health Council meeting was called to order at 9:01 a.m. by Anthony Volkar, Health Council Chair.

- 2. Roll Call Yong Xiong, Secretary

Roll call for voting members was taken and quorum was confirmed.

3. Consider Approval of Agenda and the Approval of the November 18, 2021 Minutes – Anthony Volkar, Chair

- 4. STATE AND COUNTY UPDATE Jill Perez, Chief Deputy County Administrator
 - Governor Gavin Newson's FY 2022-2023 budget proposal focuses on five priority areas, including fighting COVID-19 and healthcare expansion for Medi-Cal
 - Supervisor Angel Barajas, District 5, is the new 2022 chairman for the Board of Supervisors
 - Board of Supervisors initiated a second recruitment for a permanent County Administrator Officer and may conclude the recruitment process by March
- 5. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS UPDATE Supervisor Don Saylor, District 2
 - Board of Supervisors is focused on investments in Esparto
 - RISE, Inc. and Winters Healthcare
 - Yolo Food Hub
 - The annual Board Strategic Planning update is next Tuesday
 - Mental Health Services Act funding update will be held on January 18
 - A mini-grant program will be established as part of the American Rescue Plan funding
 - \$250,000 mini-grant program will be evenly split among the five districts at \$50,000 each
 - See the Board of Supervisors agenda packet on January 11 for the application
 - Supervisor Don Saylor encourages more community members to volunteer at vaccine clinics
- 6. COMMUNITY HEALTH BRANCH UPDATE Brian Vaughn, Public Health Director
 - Community Health Branch (CHB) continues to focus COVID-19 response efforts on high-risk populations
 - CHB has hired a new Director of Public Health Nursing
 - CHB and other counties are experiencing ongoing recruitment issues with hiring trained public health professionals due to their high demand and low supply in the workforce

- There is an additional 200 million dollars (ongoing) from the State for local health jurisdictions to fund public health infrastructure and CHB is waiting for its allocation for FY 22-23
- Governor Gavin Newson in a budget proposal has called for \$2.7 billion to expand COVID-19 response
- Health Council members are welcome to attend the next Community Engagement Work Group regarding MHSA funding

7. COUNTY COVID UPDATE - Dr. Aimee Sisson, Health Officer

Summary of the items covered in the presentation: Yolo County COVID-19 Update

- County COVID-19 case rate is at record high and still increasing
- County has high community transmission based on the CDC Indicators and Thresholds for Community Transmission of COVID-19
- COVID-19 hospitalizations are increasing
- Hospital bed availability is low
- Omicron variant now accounts for 95 percent of cases in the County
- Key protective measures against Omicron
 - Get vaccinated or boosted
 - Upgrade your mask
 - > Keep your mask on indoors
 - Get tested for COVID-19
 - > Stay home when you are sick
- Boosters are now recommended for people
 - > 12 years or older
 - It has been at least five months since second dose of Pfizer or Moderna or at least two months since dose of Johnson and Johnson
- County vaccination rate is near the state average
- Isolation requirements have changed for people infected with COVID-19
 - As short as five days if no symptoms or improved, including no fever for 24 hours and negative test on day five or later
 - Wear a mask around others through day 10
- Quarantine requirements have changed for people exposed to COVID-19
 - As short as five days if no symptoms and negative test on day five or later
 - Wear a mask around others through day 10
- Unboosted workers can continue to work
- A negative test is needed to shorten isolation
- COVID-19 testing options
 - Healthy Yolo Together
 - OptumServe
 - Covid Clinic
 - Health care providers
 - Retail pharmacies
 - ➤ Home antigen tests can now be used for isolation and quarantine purposes

8. Workgroups - Anthony Volkar, Chair

- Health Council members were assigned into four small workgroups based on the following topics
 - Health Equity (facilitated by Nicki King)
 - Infectious Disease (facilitated by Chester Austin)
 - > Children (facilitated by Anthony Volkar)

- Health Council members reviewed the Yolo County Strategic Plan goal related to their topic and considered the following questions
 - Is the stated goal and metrics sufficient to address this topic? If not, consider what additional outcomes or language should be added to the goal or metrics provided
 - In what areas related to this topic is Health Council well positioned to lead on?

- > If Health Council is to advise on policy related to this topic, what presentations would you expect to see in 2022?
- Anthony Volkar stated there may be a survey sent to Health Council members to collect data not shared in the workgroups to help frame the Health Council agenda moving forward

9. FUTURE OF THE COVID AD-HOC COMMITTEE - Anthony Volkar, Chair

- Health Council members inquired about the future of the COVID Ad-Hoc Committee and Anthony Volkar shared that Health Council leadership is still discussing the continuation and charge of the committee as it relates to COVID-19
- An invitation will be sent to Health Council members to join the weekly Public Information Officer call to get regular COVID-19 updates from Dr. Aimee Sisson
