- 4. STATE AND COUNTY UPDATE Jill Perez, Chief Deputy County Administrator
 - Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) Director Karen Larsen has submitted her resignation to the Board of Supervisors and her last day will be on February 25, 2022
 - Interim County Administrator Chad Rinde and his team will work closely with the Board of Supervisors to appoint an Interim HHSA Director and pursue recruitment for a permanent HHSA Director
 - Plans to expand the Yolo Adult Day Health Center by renovating the old Stollwood Nursing Facility on St. John's Retirement Village property has not started because St. John's will not be able to lease the facility to Dignity Health due to financial challenges
 - Yolo County is working closely with St. John's and Dignity Health to find a resolution to keep the new facility plans for Yolo Adult Day Health Center moving forward
- 5. Board of Supervisors Update Supervisor Don Saylor, District 2 and Supervisor Jim Provenza, District 4
 - American Rescue Plan (ARP) Mini Grant applications are available on the Yolo County website and due March 31, 2022
 - ARP Mini Grants program allows for localized responses to the COVID-19 pandemic and economic recovery programs that are nimble and transformative
 - ➤ Board of Supervisors recognizes there are small needs ranging from \$1,000 to \$10,000 that can leverage a positive outcome and become invisible if the focus is only on big category items
 - > ARP Mini Grant funding is an investment of \$250,000 split equally between the five Districts
 - Board of Supervisors allocated approximately \$1.8 million to address food security in Yolo County after hearing from the Food Security Workgroup
 - > \$1,200,000 Yolo Food Bank

- > \$220,000 Center for Land-Based Learning
- > \$200,000 Meals on Wheels
- > \$200,000 Senior Meal Delivery
- Board of Supervisors is committed to interviewing top candidates for the HHSA Director position
- Yolo Adult Day Health Center is a priority for the Board of Supervisors
- Family and Children Workgroup will be at the next Board of Supervisors meeting and the workgroup will
 provide recommendations about childcare

6. COMMUNITY HEALTH BRANCH UPDATE - Brian Vaughn, Public Health Director

- Community Health Branch (CHB) is moving beyond COVID work and a Tobacco Program update will be provided at the next Health Council meeting
- Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Administrator Kristin Weivoda has resigned from Yolo County employment
 - Douglas Brim is the Interim EMS Administrator
 - Recruitment for a permanent EMS Administrator will begin shortly
- CHB has hired Director of Public Health Nursing Lana Rossi and she will be introduced at the next Health Council meeting
- CHB and other counties are experiencing recruitment issues with hiring trained public health professionals due to their high demand and low supply in the workforce
- There is an additional 200 million dollars (ongoing) from the State for local health jurisdictions to fund public health infrastructure and CHB is waiting for its allocation for FY 22-23
- Health Council members are invited to attend the Community Engagement Work Group regarding MHSA funding on February 10, 2022 at 5:30 p.m. via Zoom

7. COUNTY COVID UPDATE - Dr. Aimee Sisson, Health Officer

Summary of the items covered in the presentation: Yolo County COVID-19 Update

- County COVID-19 case rate is very high but decreasing
- County has high community transmission based on the CDC Indicators and Thresholds for Community Transmission of COVID-19
- COVID-19 hospitalizations are decreasing
- Key protective measures against Omicron:
 - Get vaccinated or boosted
 - Upgrade your mask
 - > Keep your mask on indoors
 - Get tested for COVID-19
 - Stay home when you are sick
- Boosters save lives
- County vaccination rate is near the state average
- COVID-19 policies are evolving
 - Universal indoor masking
 - California Department of Public Health (CDPH) required universal indoor masking from December 15, 2021 to February 15, 2022
 - Yolo County has required universal indoor masking since July 30, 2021
 - K-12 schools
 - Universal indoor masking remains in effect per CDPH
 - Outdoor masking no longer recommended if greater than 50 percent of students vaccinated
 - Group tracing and blanket notification approaches are new contact tracing options which give schools flexibility and support in keeping children in school after an exposure

- Public Health Director Brian Vaughn suggested the COVID Ad-Hoc Committee review the Yolo County COVID Dashboard and provide recommendations on how to improve its use and effectiveness

 - Addressing and identifying community gaps and how to address them, based on Health Council's membership of public and private partnerships
 - > Receiving and communicating data received at Health Council with the wider community
 - Relaying concerns and challenges with county leaders on key issues such as health disparities, poverty, affordable housing, wages, and segregation
 - Building strong county-wide coordination due to Health Council's connection with non-profit organizations
- After Chair Anthony Volkar went over the workgroup notes, Health Council members shared additional goals, metrics, and/or presentations that are needed to help them make informed decisions about each of the following Yolo County Strategic Plan topics:
 - Health Equity
 - Comparison of income levels across the county by zip code/census track
 - Training on Human Development Index (HDI) and how data can be used by Health Council
 - o Status of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) programming for children and adults
 - o Universal Basic Income Program
 - > Fluoridation of water
 - o Presentation of health inequities data for Medi-Cal members by Partnership HealthPlan

Children

- Evaluation of appropriate foster youth placements
- Qualitative data on how children in foster care are doing and quality of care
- Status of ARP projects related to childcare
- o Federal Build Back Better plans relative to childcare and preschool in the county
- Infectious Disease
 - Vaccination rate for HPV
 - o How the county can avoid future pandemics
 - o Review of long-term COVID-19 by county epidemiologist
 - Presentation of COVID-19 wastewater testing
- Homelessness
 - No additional goals, metrics, and/or presentations shared
