- iv) J. Hulsman noted we need a list of contacts for various agencies like Public works so we can direct people's comments to the right places.
- v) S. Reed volunteered to start the list of contacts. Suggested contacts included: Animal control, Reiko (Sheriff's), OHV Investigator (Sheriff's), Website links for making requests to code enforcement & road repairs.
