This is an update to previous letters dated July 19, 2022, and November 1, 2022. Changes include:

- Updated date for the State Public Health Officer Order related to healthcare reporting
- Updated reference to Cal/OSHA regulations

Dear Yolo County Superintendents, School Leaders, and Child Care Providers:

Assembly Bill (AB) 86 previously required K-12 schools to report every case of COVID-19 to the local public health authority. This requirement within AB86 sunsetted on July 1, 2022. Moving forward, Yolo County Public Health no longer requires individual COVID-19 case reporting from child care providers and K-12 schools. Instead, **child care providers and schools must report COVID-19 outbreaks to Yolo County, including, but not limited to, when 10% or more of a student cohort is unexpectedly absent.** This outbreak reporting will allow Yolo County to provide child care providers and K-12 schools with consultation and assistance in order to reduce the risk of further transmission.

I would also like to call your attention to the following COVID-19 requirements affecting K-12 schools and child care providers and programs that remain in effect:

1. K-12 schools should refer to California Code of Regulations (CCR) Title 17, [§2500](#) and [§2508](#) for reporting guidance. Note that 17 CCR §2500 has been temporarily modified by the [State Public Health Officer Order of October 4, 2022](#).
2. Child care centers and Family child care homes should refer to the [CDPH COVID-19 Guidance for Child Care Providers and Programs](#) section “Reporting COVID-19” for additional reporting requirements.
3. As workplaces, schools and most child care programs are subject to COVID-19 workplace outbreak reporting requirements stipulated in the [Cal/OSHA COVID-19 Prevention Non-Emergency Regulations](#)
