Last Free Tire Recycling Event of the Year

(**Woodland, CA**) – On November 5^{th,} from 9:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., Yolo County is hosting a free tire recycling event at the Clarksburg Corporation Yard at 51230 Clarksburg Road. Yolo County residents are encouraged to turn in their used passenger car, truck, or farm tractor tires during this free event, made possible through a grant from the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle). Participants may bring in up to nine (9) tries to be recycled free of charge.

In 2022, 3,378 tires have already been collected under this grant. We aim to collect a total of 5,000 tires before the end of this year. Please do your part for the environment by responsibly disposing of your tires this coming Saturday in Clarksburg. As we head into the Winter months, tires can become a breeding ground for mosquitos. Proposal disposal is critical so that tire piles do not create a place for mosquitos to lay their eggs and later hatch and mature.

Things to remember when participating in this tire recycling event:

- There is a limit of no more than nine (9) tires. For more information on restrictions, contact Pam Hedrick, Yolo County Recycling Coordinator at (530) 666-8856.
- Tires that will be accepted include all passenger car, truck, and tractor tires with or without rims and that are air-filled with no solid areas.
- Heavy equipment tires, tires with a diameter greater than 60 inches, tract tires, business-generated tires, or bins full of tires are not accepted.
- Farmers and ranchers may contact the Yolo County Environmental Health at (530) 666-8646 to obtain a hauler permit allowing for the transport of up to 20 tires per vehicle. There is a 40-tire limit per participating resident or farm.
