Subject: Update Outcomes & Metrics Ad Hoc Subcommittee term and membership

Background

During the October 11, 2021 meeting, the CCP formed an Outcomes and Metrics Ad Hoc Subcommittee to develop CCP budget policies to implement effective and feasible outcome measures and metrics. The Subcommittee was charged with coordinating with the CCP analyst and CCP fiscal admin to develop monthly, quarterly and/or annual procedures associated with implementing these policies, and with recommending amendments to the CCP Bylaws as they pertain to the budget outcomes and metrics. The CCP approved the below membership of this Subcommittee for a three-month period; a term which was subsequently extended for an additional three months:

- Dale Johnson, Sheriff's Office
- Dan Fruchtenicht, Probation Department
- Ian Evans, Health & Human Services
- Laura Valdes, representing Victim Services

The Draft 2023-2025 Strategic Plan includes a strategy to “[d]evelop metrics and common methods to measure success for CCP funded programs” by June 30, 2023 and assigns that responsibility to the Outcome and Metrics Ad Hoc Subcommittee.

Staff Recommendation

Update the membership of the Outcomes and Metrics Ad Hoc Subcommittee and authorize the subcommittee to convene until June 30, 2023 for the purpose of developing and implementing metrics for the 2023-2025 Strategic Plan as well as budget policies to implement effective and feasible outcome measures. The subcommittee will provide a progress report at the January 9, 2023 meeting.

Subject: Consider updating the Public Relations Ad Hoc Subcommittee's charter, term and membership

Background

The Yolo County CCP formed and approved guidelines for a Public Relations Subcommittee on February 9, 2015. The guidelines have not been updated since then nor has the subcommittee met recently. Due to rapid shifts in the media environment, the current guidelines are not necessarily in line with modern requirements and may require updates, especially regarding social media response.

Current Guidelines

The current guidelines call for the subcommittee to have no less than three members, with at least one member from the Probation Department, the District Attorney's Office, and the Public Defender. The body may have up to five members, with the two additional seats filled by a majority vote of the CCP Executive Committee. Information released in the name of the CCP requires either: 1) unanimous approval of the CCP Public Relations Subcommittee: or 2) majority approval of the CCP Executive Committee.

The guidelines call for the Probation Department to manage and maintain a website, as well as email lists which receive annual information "pushes." With the addition of a CCP Analyst position in the County Administrator's office, it would make sense for this person to now take on these responsibilities. The guidelines further state that social media will not be utilized by the CCP. In the current media environment, the subcommittee may want to reconsider that guideline.

Staff Recommendation

Appoint and/or confirm the CCP Public Relations Ad Hoc Subcommittee membership and authorize the subcommittee for an additional six-month term starting in January 2023. The subcommittee will review and, if deemed necessary, revise the existing guidelines and report back to the full CCP membership.

Subject: Consider process for appointing the Community-Based Organization member to the CCP

Background

The composition of the CCP is established in Penal Code section 1230 and includes “a representative from a community-based organization (CBO) with experience in successfully providing rehabilitative services to persons who have been convicted of a criminal offense.” In January of 2021, the CCP adopted bylaws that noted the CBO representative would be selected by the CCP (Attachment A). The approach taken for such appointments is entirely within the CCP’s discretion, as state law is silent on the topic.

At the August 22, 2022 meeting of the CCP, member Marc Nigel resigned from the CCP, leaving the CBO Representative position vacant.

Staff Recommendation

Authorize an ad hoc subcommittee to determine a process for advertising the vacancy, recruiting candidates and ultimately appointing a CBO member to the CCP. The ad hoc subcommittee will return with a proposed process at the January 9, 2023 meeting of the CCP, at which time the CCP may approve or further revise the process for selection.

Subject: Consider Innovation funding proposal from the Yolo Conflict Resolution Center in the amount of \$75,000 to increase the community's understanding of and participation in Restorative Justice, with the objective of expanding the use of Restorative Justice opportunities.

Background

The Yolo Conflict Resolution Center (YCRC) provides dispute resolution services in accordance with the Dispute Resolutions Programs Act of 1986 (DRPA). They have provided these services to Yolo County since 2014-15 when they were the sole bidder for a County-issued RFP.

In the 2021-22 fiscal year, YCRC was awarded \$50,000 in Innovation funding to increase program participation over two fiscal years, however, as the year concluded YCRC had not yet drawn any of these funds down for use. At that time, staff reached out to YCRC and was informed that they would like to submit a revised scope for funding.

Request

YCRC is requesting \$75,000 in Innovation funding to perform additional outreach and education within Yolo County on available Restorative Justice programs and opportunities. The proposal details their intention to provide community information sessions and create two videos detailing the Restorative Justice process and featuring testimonials from service partners and program participants. YCRC believes that greater community knowledge of Restorative Justice will result in greater interest in and usage of available programs and resources, which will further the current CCP Strategic Plan goal of expanding the use of Restorative Justice programs.

Staff Recommendation

Receive a presentation from YCRC Executive Director Kara Hunter on their proposal and consider a request for \$75,000 in innovation funding to increase the community's understanding of and participation in Restorative Justice.

Proposal title- Increasing Community Understanding of Restorative Justice and Potential Participant Participation

Proposal purpose and alignment with the CCP Strategic Plan and draft CCP budget policies

This proposal meets the following goals and objectives as described in the 2019-2022 CCP Strategic Plan.

- Goal 1: Ensure a Safe Environment for All Residents and Visitors by Reducing and Preventing Local Crime and Reducing Recidivism
- Goal 2: Restore Victims and the Community and Hold Offenders Accountable
- Goal 3: Build Offender Competency and Support Community Reintegration

Objectives:

- Expand the use of restorative justice programs.

Data shows that when implemented with integrity and adherence to Restorative Justice values and principles, recidivism rates for offenders are lower than those rates when participating in the traditional court processes. Additionally, when Victims are invited and engaged in a timely manner for participation in an RJ process, their satisfaction with that process is positive. Finally, when offenders are appropriately engaged for an RJ process, their taking responsibility for their action is the first step in their participation.

Restorative Justice can be utilized as a means of diversion, and as a means of rehabilitation. This bodes well for the use of this practice for offenders with previous criminal history to build their understanding of their behavior and therefore build competency in how to behave more positively in the future.

YCRC has ran it's own Restorative Justice programs and has worked with the DAs office on their RJP program (formerly known as Neighborhood Court) for over the last five years. In that time, one of the key learnings has been how difficult the intake process can be because the public has very little understanding or knowledge of what Restorative Justice is and how it works. Therefore, one clear next step in the evolution of Restorative Justice in Yolo County is to provide a comprehensive Community Education effort.

Cost estimate for the program - \$75,000

Timeframe for the program – Annual

Request for Treatment or Innovation – This is a request for Innovation Funding

Any outcomes/metrics anticipated to be tracked as part of the program that enact the CCP Strategic Plan

This proposal is in line with the Goals and Objectives of the CCP 2019-2022 Strategic Plan as listed above. As a demonstration of outcomes, YCRC will track the following:

- YCRC will provide community information sessions and presentations to provide information on what Restorative Justice is, how it works, as well as what participation looks like. These sessions and presentations are designed for all members of the community not just those identified as potential participants in a Restorative Justice process. YCRC will track the number of persons that attend these sessions/presentations over the fund period.
- YCRC will take the lead on producing two videos for distribution. One video will include participant testimonies as well as input from partners on their experience and opinions around the impact and potential of Restorative Justice. A second video will illustrate how the Restorative Justice process works to give folks an opportunity to develop a point of reference on what participation in a Restorative Justice conference looks and feels like.

Subject: Approve referral of the 2023-2025 CCP Strategic Plan to the Board of Supervisors for approval

Background

In early 2022, the CCP began to discuss a process for developing the 2023-2025 CCP Strategic Plan. As the desired process included creating opportunities to receive public input, the CCP held two Community Engagement Meetings over the summer to receive feedback on the CCP's mission and goals, as well as where the CCP should focus its efforts going forward. The CCP has also held several special meetings throughout the year to discuss and draft the final language. The 2023-2025 Strategic Plan considers public and CCP input and the following factors:

- Strategies in the 2019-2022 CCP Plan that required continued attention
- Unaddressed gaps identified in the criminal justice continuum of care Sequential Intercept Map (SIM)
- How the goals address specific intercepts in the SIM
- Employing language which references "individuals" vs. "offenders"
- Ensuring the provision of culturally competent programs and services
- Prioritizing re-entry and community support services, especially for the PRCS/1170 population
- Enhancing the public's understanding of the work the CCP

Staff Recommendation

Refer the final version of the 2023-2025 Strategic Plan (Attachment A) to the Board of Supervisors for approval at the January 10, 2023 meeting.

Next Steps

Following Board of Supervisors approval of the CCP Strategic Plan, the CCP Analyst will coordinate development of tactical plans for each of the strategies, in collaboration with appropriate CCP department staff. Tactical plans will include the steps necessary to implement the identified strategies and achieve the desired outcomes. For example, an action in the tactical plan for increasing in-custody programming would be to hire a treatment coordinator.

The CCP Analyst will also be tasked with reviewing other like-sized and like-minded counties' strategic plans to identify opportunities that could be implemented in Yolo County. As appropriate, these opportunities could: 1) be rolled into the tactical plans; 2) be added as additional outcomes or strategies to the 2023-2025 Strategic Plan; or 3) be put in a parking lot for inclusion in the 2026-2028 Strategic Plan.
