- 5. Member Announcements/Sharing
 - Linda Copeland:
 - o CA Child and Youth Gran Initiative has multiple pots of money to support child and youth mental health over the next 5 years
 - o One of these grants is opening for applications at the end of October to support parent and caregiver trainings
 - These applications are for evidence-based practices
 - If your agency doesn't have certified staff in these areas, you can apply for the grant and have your staff trained and certified

- 6. DISCUSSION OF PREVIOUSLY PRESENTED YOLO COUNTY MCAH DATA Julian Lopez, MPH, Public Health Epidemiologist
 - Early entry to prenatal care, can this be broken down by income level to see if there was difference between groups?
 - Julian is currently working on breaking this information by race and ethnicity
 - The births in the county are from those who have Yolo County addresses; it doesn't mean they delivered in Yolo County
 - Julian will work on gathering data for those women that are Yolo County residents who delivered out of county

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- The question arose if data is collected from the Tribal community (Julian will follow up on this)
- Data source for entry into prenatal care is gathered from the vital statistics birth master file, which means it's reported by the delivery hospital
- The question was asked regarding data for prenatal care in Clarksburg? It's missing from a lot of data presentations
- Julian will check if the data is available by age
- The hospitalizations for pregnant women with mental health or substance abuse is recorded at labor and birth
- Julian will check to see how the diagnosis data is gathered for pregnant women who are hospitalized with a diagnosis of mental health or substance abuse and if substance includes marijuana
- When it comes to the messaging around breastfeeding, it would be nice to have Health Care Providers delivering the same message when it comes to breastfeeding and formula
- It was suggested to have some type of training on breastfeeding for Health Care Providers and offering CME's
- For neonatal deaths, one death can cause a big change in the numbers, that is something to keep in mind when looking at the change/spike in the data
- Julian has submitted a request to CHDP for the fetal death data in 2020, as soon as he has the data he'll provide it
- Records for FIMR are being reviewed when received by a PHN
- A FIMR meeting has been on hold due to staffing shortage
