4. COMMUNITY HEALTH BRANCH REPORT

- Brian Vaughn:
 - There are talks that we will have to resume meeting in person after February 2023
 - o The vaccine schedule for COVID and Flu can be found on our website
 - There have been several tobacco items that have been pushed forward
 - A presentation was given to the board last week on package sizing and discounting which we have no prohibited; this will make it less accessible for kids
 - We are in the process of planning for our Mental Health Services Act funds for a new 3-year plan
 - o There is a community engagement workgroup that
 - If you would like to provide feedback, you can look on our website and search MHSA
 - o COVID functions have been integrated with infection control team
 - There is approval to higher a Manager for MCAH

5. MEMBER ANNOUNCEMENTS/SHARING

- The group agreed to meet in person for January's meeting
- Linda Copeland:
 - Request for applications for Evidence Based Practices for Parents and Caregivers Trainings will not go out until December
 - Department of Healthcare Services will have a 4th round of grants to expand home visiting services
 - There is a state law mandating contingency management treatment that will be coming out with Medi-Cal; this pays people to stay sober and is an evidence-based treatment

6. Review 0-5 Age Range Data From Julian's Presentation

- Gaby will send out Julian's responses to the questions from last meeting
- We will review the data at January's meeting

7. FIRST FIVE DATA PRESENTATION 0-5 AGE RANGE- SARAH HARTMAN

- Yolo County ranks last for income inequality in the entire state of California
- In 2021 Yolo County had a total poverty rate of 17% with 35,000 people living in poverty

• Maternal Health:

- o Daily folic acid use during pregnancy is average with the state and less with those on Medi-Cal in Yolo County
- Excessive weight gain during pregnancy is slightly lower than the state average
- Inadequate weight gain during pregnancy is close to that of the state
- o Alcohol use in 3rd trimester is higher in Yolo County than that of the state
- o Smoking in 3rd trimester is higher than that of the state
- Smoking during postpartum is significantly higher than that of the state, especially in the Medi-Cal population
- Cannabis use during pregnancy is average with the state except for the Medi-Cal population, those numbers are significantly higher

• Social Hardships During the Childbearing Year, 2016-2018:

- Prenatal Depression is similar in Yolo County with the state except with Yolo County Medi-Cal population, it is significantly higher
- Postpartum depression is slightly lower in Yolo County to that of the state, again with he exception of the Medi-Cal population, it is higher in this population
- o No practical or emotional support is slightly higher in Yolo County compared to the state

• Pandemic Impact in California:

- o Drop in outpatient visits 2019-2020 was highest among children ages 5-12
- O Dental visits in children dropped 40% in 2020
- Vaccines in children decreased by 40% in 2020
- Over 16,000 children in CA lost a primary caregiver due to COVID-19 between April 2020-June 2021; 2/3 were Latino/a

• Home Visiting & Welcome Baby:

- o More than 2 million CA families had a pregnant women or children aged 0 to 6
- Home visiting programs have proven benefits to families
- Frist 5 Yolo's Welcome Baby is addressing the need by providing critical home visiting services to families immediately postpartum
