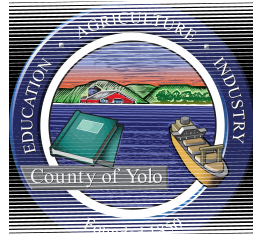

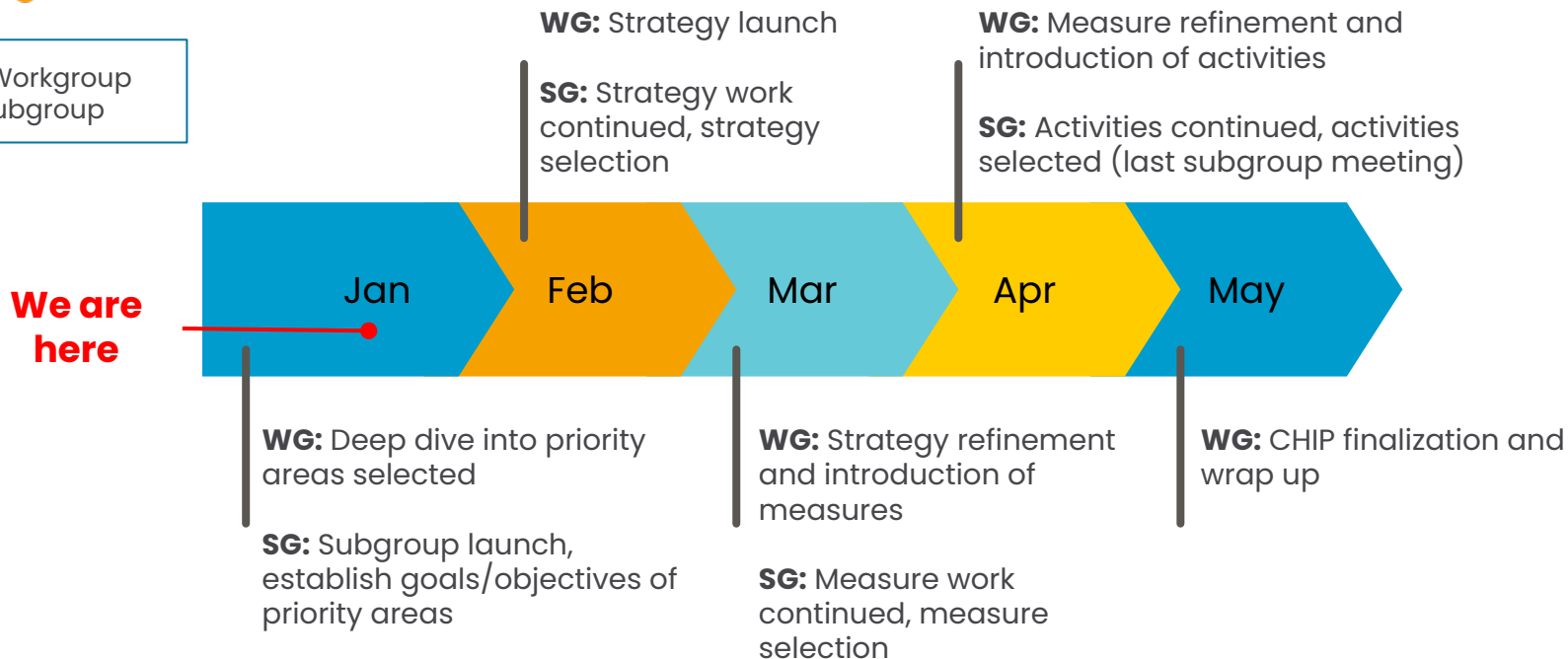
Prioritization: Meeting Recap

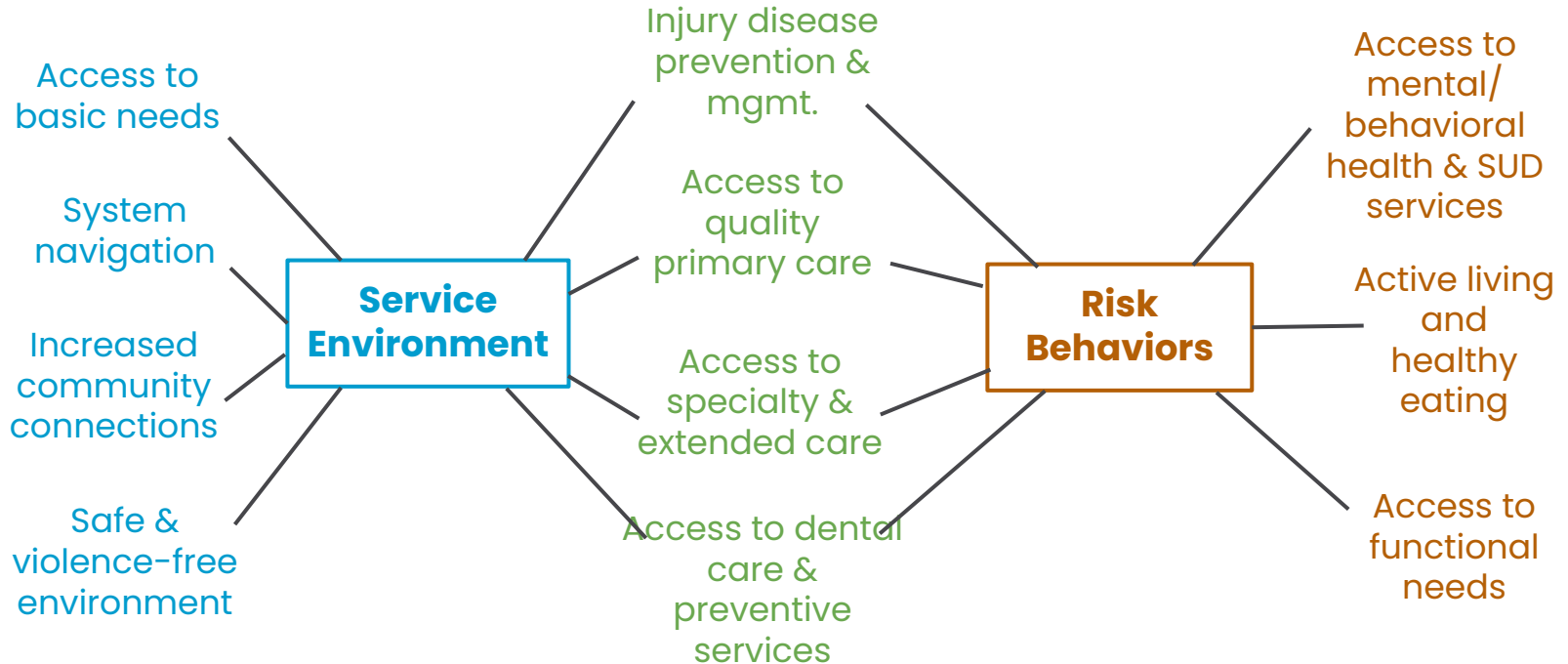

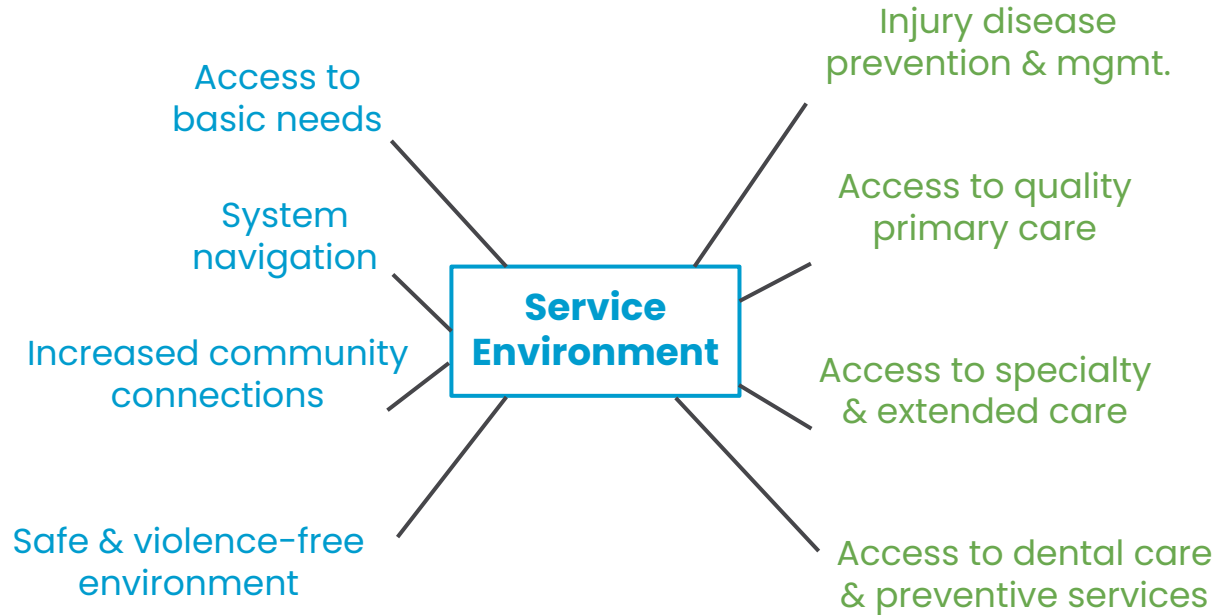

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Service Environment: Activities

What kinds of action is being taken? in what focus areas?

- Dawn: developing an enhanced case management program through CalAIM - not in full rollout yet but one of key focuses is around MH and older adults - and also helping to transition older and disabled adults- people trying to transition out of skilled nursing facilities and back into the community - Dignity Health
- Stacy McCall - Winters - we are opening new site and co locating with RISE - expand options for care in the region- currently only located in Winters
- Celina - Empower Yolo - victims services - legal services, advocacy, etc - as a resource center provide supports for economic needs - rental assistance, housing, etc



Service Environment: Activities Cont.

What kinds of action is being taken? in what focus areas?

- Leon - aware of early work and planning with Yolo County Child Care council and Yolo OE - in relation to facilitating expansion of TK for 3 and 4 year olds - in process of becoming more aware of that - dearth of data - 2020 data, published early 2021, focus on early childhood education - need more data
- Kaitlyn Marsh - adapted how children access services within the county - CalAim has helped open up how children are diagnosed and how they receive services when diagnosed - prog for student services mental health - allows more children to access mental health services regardless
- Christina - Michel-Albers - ED of Children's Therapy Center - emphasizing navigating resources and referrals - 0-5 population in the county - collecting people with services they need - speech therapy - very difficult w that population - impacts of COVID on 0-3 population accessing services has been huge difficulty



Service Environment: Gaps

- accessing services has been big problem for 0-3 - huge developmental needs (Christina)
- lack of post-COVID data (Leon and Christina)
- eviction prevention funds (Celina), affordable housing
- Juan - ER at Sutter - seeing a lot of chronic health problems in ER because they cant access primary care - we have great social workers, help them figure out through insurance what PCP they could see but PCP doesn't have appointments, end up back in ER - volume of patients we get requiring this shows lots of barriers - also a lot of SUD
- Katie Curran - not enough primary care providers and Marriage and Family Therapists in our community - even those who want to come to our community, there just aren't enough people doing the work, and we have nothing to lure people to Yolo County - some sort of tool needed to recruit folks
- Juan - moved here in 2016 - moved to WEst Sac, but families move according to good schools, influences where people choose to live
- Leon - needs in 0-5 group now different, developmental delays require different training



Service Environment: Gaps Cont.

- access to vision and dental care – same issue, there just aren't enough providers, waitlists are really long – dental has maybe gotten better with Communicare
- mental health care for older adults
- lack of trauma informed services – some clients struggle accessing services because they don't feel comfortable – lack of culturally responsive services – language and culture
- there are programs to support diabetes education but people don't take/have the time to receive education – exacerbated by the fact that there isn't really primary care available – so preventative education for chronic disease is lacking because people don't have the bandwidth
- lack of shelter space for people – no family shelter in this community – for safety, there's a distrust of law enforcement – not everyone comfortable reporting things
- housing is a challenge in all our communities – also focusing on youth homelessness – looking at entry

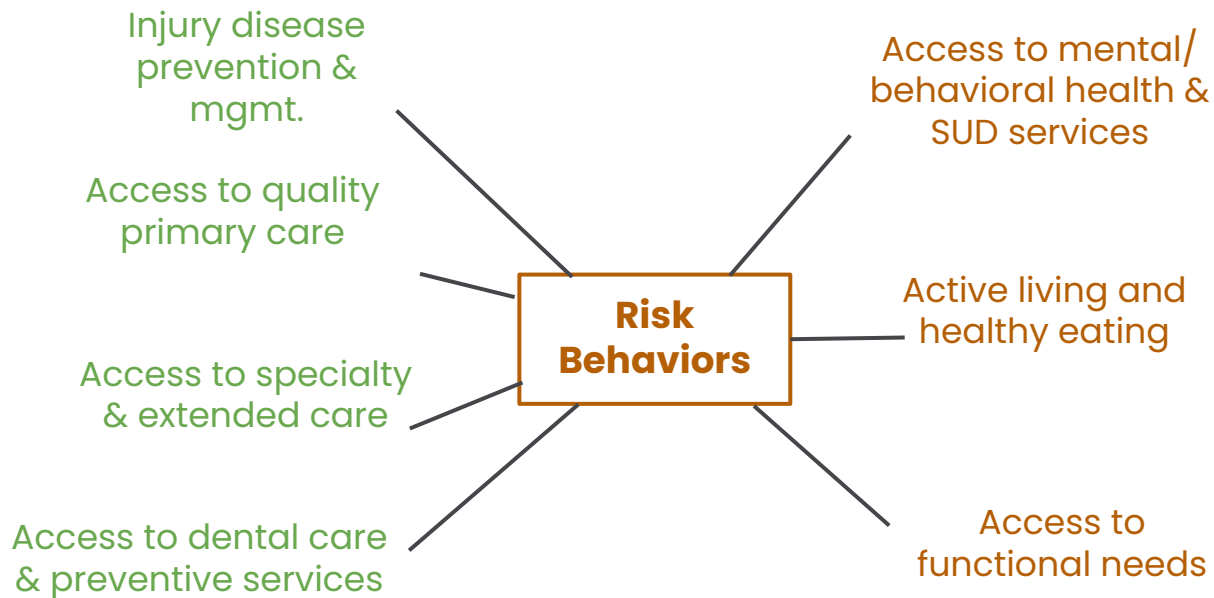

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Risk Behaviors: Activities

What kinds of action is being taken? in what focus areas?

- CalFresh Healthy Living program
- Oral Health program - community education and awareness campaigns
- Walk with Friends community walking program and free produce distribution
- “It Only Takes” mental health campaign - education on managing stress & healthy habits
- Education on tobacco use and other drugs; cessation assistance
- Meals on Wheels delivering food to elderly
- Diabetes education, fall prevention programs, injury prevention programs, lock boxes, providing home safety equipment; access to physical therapy and other healthcare services; dental services; community screenings (cancer, diabetes, etc.); MAT program; healthy cooking classes; exercise classes (bingo-cise)
- FNL program; MHFA and suicide prevention trainings



Risk Behaviors: Activities Cont.

What kinds of action is being taken? in what focus areas?

- Help me grow (developmental screenings and other screenings); in-home therapy services; family engagement services; home visiting model; prenatal and early parenting services; address attachment issues in early childhood
- Occupational health and safety trainings (employers, workers, promotores)
- Food distribution; kids farmers market program at schools; at-home program
- MH services available to children and families; residential treatment
- FQHCs (CommuniCare) doing a lot of work in this area
- Nutrition education that also impacts dental health
- Program series on life skills/health/job readiness w/ ongoing case management
- School-based behavioral health providers; comprehensive behavioral health services



Risk Behaviors: Gaps

- Access and eligibility
- Transportation
- Broader navigation services
- Awareness of services – culturally and linguistically sensitive
- Going out into the community
- Stigma
- Housing
- Park with walking track for elderly
- Funding
- Staff shortage (high turnover, limited budget)
- Changing needs

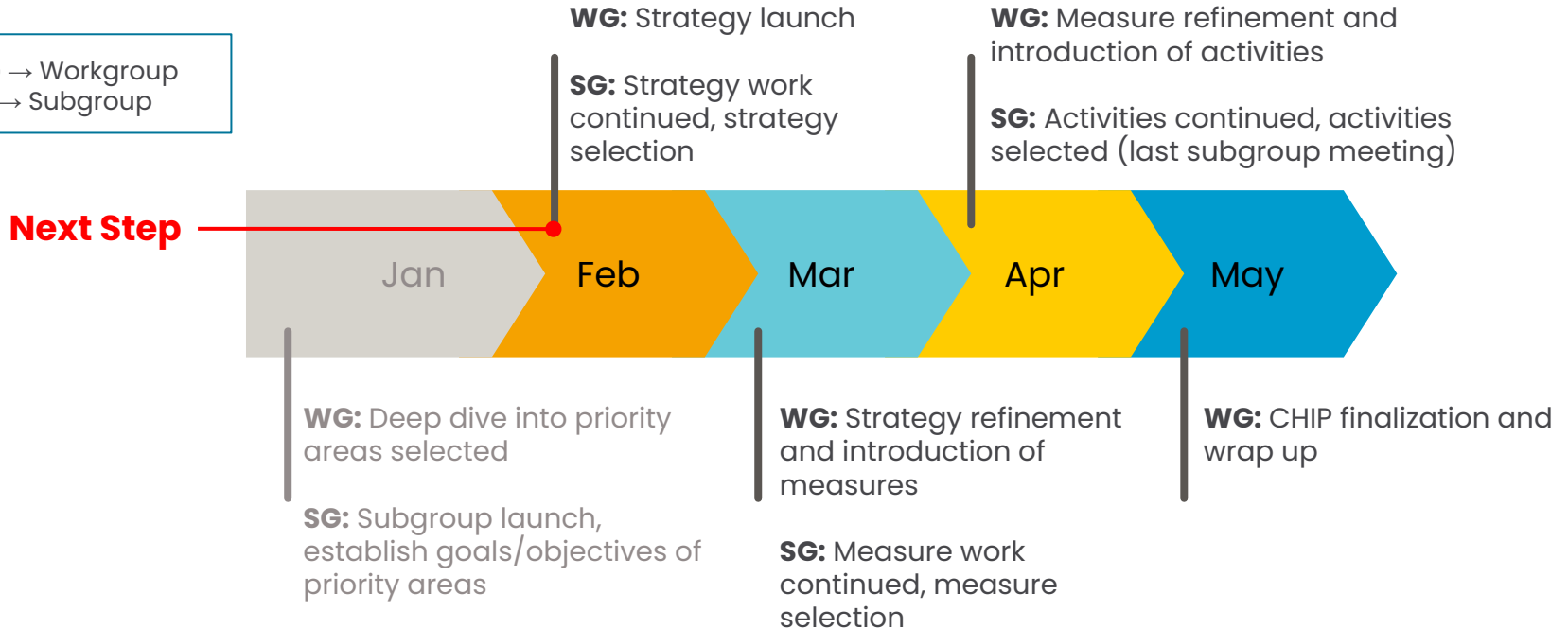
