**Subject**: Mandatory Buprenorphine Training

## **MEMORANDUM**

We will be expanding Paramedic's scope of practice in Yolo County to include Buprenorphine, with a planned rollout date of June 1, 2023 (subject to change). To achieve this scope expansion, we will be requiring Paramedics to complete training in two parts.

**Part One:** Complete a mandatory Buprenorphine online training that includes a 45-minute video and a 20-question test. You must score 80% or better on the test for successful completion of the training. In the event that you do not get 80%, you must re-watch the video and retake the test. You will be receiving 1-hour of CEs for this online training.

Part Two: In May 2023, we will be holding mandatory in-person ALS Update classes. You must complete the Buprenorphine online training prior to attending an ALS Update class.

You may begin part one now by watching the Buprenorphine online video and taking the test.

Important: To maintain active Paramedic accreditation with YEMSA, you will be required to complete both parts: the online Buprenorphine training and the in-person ALS Update 4-hour class. Failure to complete these two (2) training requirements will result in the suspension of your YEMSA accreditation.
