- 4. IDENTIFYING HEALTH COUNCIL PRIORITIES- Anthony Volkar, Chair
 - Health Council makes a presentation to the Board of Supervisors to share priorities and the topics they have been working on. Google survey will go out to the members after the meeting to collect ideas and to identify the priorities of the Health Council. The list will be narrowed down and members will be asked to vote on top choices. The information will be gathered in a report and submitted to the Board of Supervisors. The top five priorities will be shared in the presentation. Draft results will be shared and discussed with the Health Council in the next meeting.
- 5. REVIEW OF GOAL SETTING AND COUNCIL PRIORITIES Anthony Volkar, Chair
 - Since "health" is a very big over encompassing approach, it was challenging to structure the Health Council Meetings. The previous "Goal Setting" sessions during Health Council meetings have been very helpful for identifying the priorities and goals of the Health Council and to structure meeting agendas.
 - To consider the goals and outcomes for the upcoming year, members of the Health Council were asked to
 participate in a workshop, where facilitators lead discussions on Health Equity, Homelessness, Children and
 Infectious Disease in smaller groups. To explain the process, the items and the results from last year's
 workshop were revisited. Notes taken during the workshop will allow leadership to plan future agendas and
 presentations for the coming year.

 - Leon Schimmel:
 - Getting accurate data about what unmet needs in childcare are important to allocate budget spendings.

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- Valerie Olson:
 - What are the results of the foster youth programs?
 - Linda Copeland:
 - ACEs screening and training the health professionals and other on how to remote resiliency. Also doing ACEs screening and resiliency support in school districts.
- Ximena Diez-Jackson:
 - Chronic absenteeism in the Country is said to be the highest it has ever been. It would be nice to see the up to date data and how it is in Yolo County.
- o Mark Ho:
 - More eligibility data for the social programs are needed.
- Health Equity:
 - Michelle Famula:
 - The role of the new DEI officer for the County in relation to Health Equity.
 - Public health in all policies concept, especially in community planning.
 - Chester Austin:
 - Updated data about infectious diseases other than STD and tuberculosis. Data about the higher risk areas where the efforts can be focused. Update on the status of the actions that were planned regarding this area.

 - The number provided for the homeless has doubled.
 - What percentage of homeless people can be converted into housing?
 - Creating a database for the homeless services.
 - What are the steps that can be taken to prevent someone from becoming homeless and how to identify the risk factors?

- Sheila Allen suggested reminding Board of Supervisors about the group of community representatives in the Health Council who can help with the issues coming forward that they know about.
- Chester Austin suggested forming subcommittees for each of these topics where key community stakeholders can be brought into the discussion.
