

It's That Time

Ludhorff & Scalmanini Consulting Engineers (LSCE) has been hired by the County to update the Wild Wings CSA water and wastewater rates. These rates were last updated in 2018. LSCE will be following standard water industry practices, AWWA standards, and Proposition 218 requirements related to the rate update process.

Revenue requirements are being updated based on reviewing past utility system costs and projecting future revenue requirements for utility operations, capital improvements, and regulatory compliance costs. LSCE interviewed the private contract operators, received updated costs from vendors and suppliers, and updated permit, energy and chemical costs based on current and projected prices.

Please attend the October 4, 2023, Wild Wings Advisory Committee meeting and participate in the rate update process.
