In June 2022 we received approval to award to CommuniCare Health Centers and began working with their team their team and collaborating with the Sheriff's Office on program launch. All parties are meeting ongoing to finalize program space, structure, and budget with the hope to launch in the next 2 months.</p>
.10 FTE SUD Services Supervisor	<p>The In Custody Treatment Program will provide access to SUD Treatment for individuals incarcerated at the Yolo County Detention Center. .40 FTE Behavioral Health Clinician	<p>Collaboration of this program will be coordinate by Probation, Sheriff and Communicare.</p> <p>In custody services are hard to fund without grants or grant money, so we are appreciative of the funding for this program and think that it's launch has already greatly impacted clients receiving services in custody. We look forward to the outcomes that this program will produce.</p>
