- Switch to rechargeable batteries to save money and reduce toxic materials.

Green Idea:

Rechargeable batteries can be used instead of single-use batteries to power up most electronics.

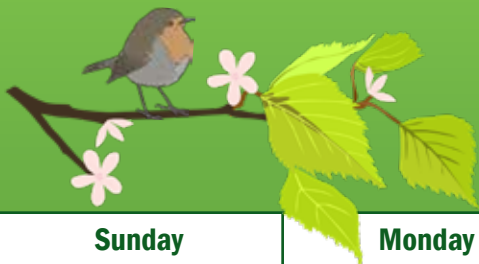

Learn to recycle right

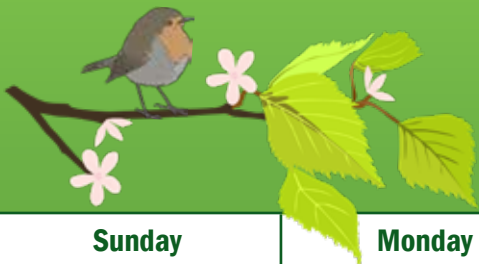
Let's sort out the confusion on recycling

- The only glass items that are recyclable are food and beverage containers.
- Items must be made out of ONE single material to be recyclable. Example: an empty metal can is recyclable. A coffee can with a metal rim and a paperboard middle is not recyclable.
- Any paper product that is used to hold or wipe food or beverages is not recyclable, but can usually go into the organics bin.
- Rinse and dry recyclable containers before placing them in your recycling cart.

Green Idea:

Don't bag your recyclables. Plastic bags cannot be recycled and contaminate batches of good recyclables.

Understand “organics”

It's more than just organic produce

When it comes to sorting waste, “organic materials” means food scraps, food-soiled paper, landscape trimmings, wood, paper, cardboard and other plant and animal-based products.

Green Idea:

Some organic materials can be recycled, like paper and cardboard. Other organic materials can be composted.

Commit to keeping organics out of the landfill

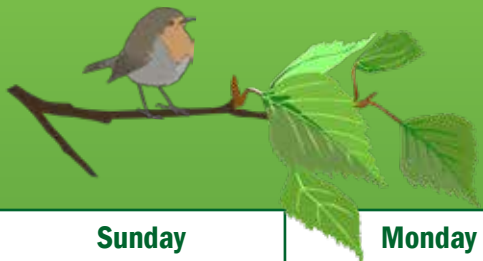
Sort materials into the correct waste bin

Methane gas is a climate super pollutant, 84 times more potent than carbon dioxide.

Half of what Californians send to landfills is organic waste, which creates 20% of the state's methane emissions as it slowly decomposes.

Green Idea:
Use a counter-top bin to make it easier to collect food scraps.

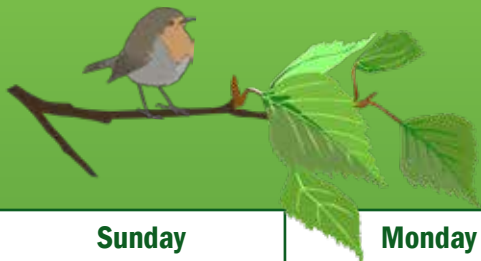
You can make a positive difference by sorting

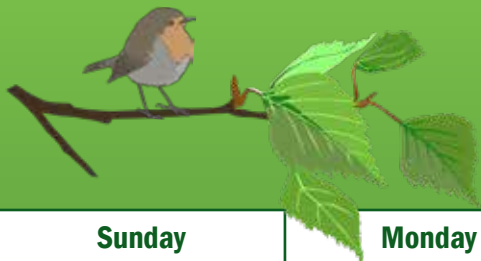

Reduce Litter

Keep waste in bins where it belongs

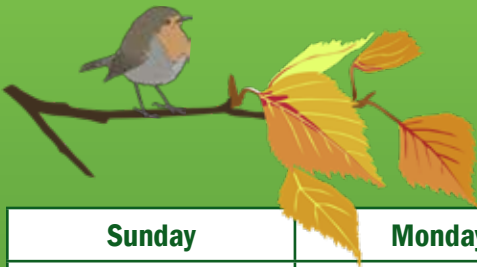
Litter can happen accidentally. Fortunately, we can prevent litter before it starts.

- Keep the lids closed on all outdoor waste bins to prevent windblown litter.
- Bag up waste securely in your car to prevent it from blowing out a window or falling out when you open the door.
- Items tossed in the back of a truck are NOT secure and WILL blow out. Secure waste in bags and use a tarp or tie down loads securely in a truck or trailer.



Green Idea:

Tie plastic film and bags in a knot before throwing them in the trash to prevent them from blowing away when the trash is emptied.

Composting is nature's way of recycling nutrients. When you place items in your organics cart, they are sent to a local facility and turned into compost. You can also compost materials at home.

Reduce Food Waste

Avoid wasted food by careful planning

Shop smart Shop with meals in mind. Consider how many meals you'll eat at home that week when you shop. Check your kitchen first and note items you already have.

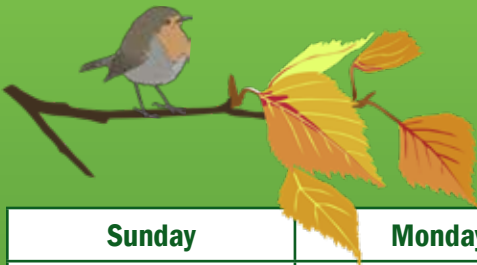
Prepare perishable foods immediately Not only will this ensure food won't go bad, but it will be easier to whip up meals later in the week, saving time.

Store food correctly Know which fruits and vegetables stay fresh longer inside or outside the fridge.



Green Idea:

Befriend your freezer and visit it often. Freeze food such as bread, sliced fruit, or meat that you know you won't be able to eat in time.

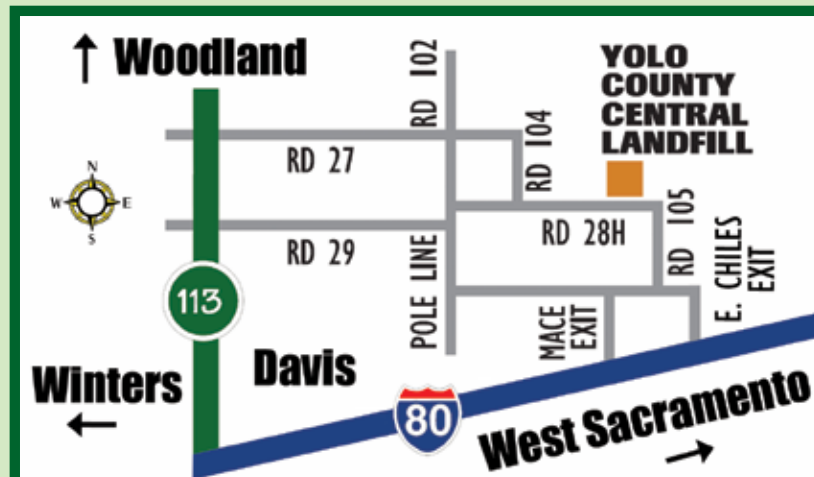
